Executive Summary

This report documents the results of performance measurements made using NotesBench for Lotus Domino Server Release 4.51 with the IBM PC Server 704, running Lotus Domino Server Release 4.51 on Microsoft Windows NT Server Version 4.0 with Service Pack 3. The results for the IBM PC Server 704 are based on two NotesBench workloads: Mail-only and Mail and Shared Database (MailDB), which were run on a single configuration.

The system measured was an IBM PC Server 704, configured with two 200MHz¹ Intel^{**} Pentium^{**} Pro processors, 768MB of memory, and ten 4.51GB hard disk drives. The PC Server 704 supported a Mail-only workload of 2,850 active mail users and a workload of 2,050 active MailDB users (see price/performance results² in Table 1).

In addition to the IBM PC Server 704 system under test (SUT), the benchmarked configuration used three destination servers, 14 client driver systems and one controller system. All systems were connected on a single 100Mbps Ethernet LAN segment, using the TCP/IP network protocol. For detailed configuration information, see Appendix A: Overall Test Setup and Software Versions.

The PC Server Performance Laboratory in the IBM PC Company conducted the benchmark in June, and KMDS Technical Associates, Inc., audited the results in June.

NotesBench provides an objective method for evaluating the performance of different platforms running Lotus Domino Server Release 4.51. NotesBench generates a transactions-per-minute (tpm) throughput metric, called a NotesMark, for each test, along with a value for the maximum capacity (number of users) supported, and the average response time.

Benchmarking Objectives

The benchmark objective was to provide customers with information on the number of Lotus Domino Server Release 4.51 Mail-only and MailDB users supported on the IBM PC Server 704 system with two 200MHz Pentium Pro processors. Performance measurements on IBM PC Servers using NotesBench for the Domino Server Release 4.x are ongoing.

¹ MHz denotes the internal clock speed of the microprocessor; other factors also affect application speed.

Test Methodologies

Test Setup and Hardware/Software Configuration

The IBM PC Server 704 system under test used two 200MHz Pentium Pro processors (512KB of L2 write-back cache per processor); 768MB of memory; ten 4.51GB³ Wide Ultra SCSI hard disk drives configured as a RAID-0 array, using an IBM PC ServeRAID SCSI Adapter; and one IBM 100/10 Ethernet PCI Adapter. The IBM PC Server 704 system under test ran Microsoft Windows NT Server Version 4.0 with Service Pack 3 and Domino Server Release 4.51. For these tests, a single 100Mbps Ethernet LAN segment was used. The system under test, the destination servers, and the driver systems were connected to the LAN by two Bay Networks BayStack 201 100BaseT Hubs.

For the PC Server 704 (SUT), the following Power-on Setup parameters were changed from their default settings:

- IOQ Depth = 8
- Outbound Posting = Enable
- Address Bit Permitting = Enable

The RAID controller configuration value for Stripe Unit Size was set at 16KB.

The following NOTES.INI parameters were modified as recommended in the NotesBench operator's manual:

The following parameters were added to suppress database activity logging after long runs and to capture server console output:

NO_FORCE_ACTIVITY_LOGGING=1 DEBUG_OUTFILE=D:\SUTDATA\SUTINFO

All Notes server tasks were disabled except Replica, Router and Update.

All Domino data files were located on the E - partition, which was formatted with an Allocation Unit Size of 512 bytes. The Domino executables were placed on the C - partition.

³ When referring to hard drive capacity, GB stands for one thousand million bytes. Total user-accessible capacity may vary depending on operating environments.

Test Procedures

Several trial test runs were conducted and system resource utilization was monitored using Windows NT Performance Monitor (PERFMON). This enabled us to optimize the system configuration while maximizing balanced system resources. We let the number of processors in the system determine our memory subsystem and disk subsystem configurations. To maximize memory performance, we selected from specific memory size increments. Smaller memory sizes may support the maximum number of users achieved, albeit at lower overall system performance. Audited runs were conducted with no performance monitoring to avoid the performance penalty incurred in the use of the system performance monitor.

The number of users was distributed over 14 clients. Each client added 100 to 260 users to the system under test. The first client to be started added the most users. Subsequent clients added users at the interval of 4 to 10 minutes apart, adding progressively fewer users to the system under test. All users were connected to the system under test in 85 minutes or less. The tests were run continuously for a total duration of about 8-1/2 hours.

For both the Mail and MailDB test, users were added in a manner that simulated the staggered connection schedule of a real-world environment. In both tests, the system under test ran for an extended period of about 8-1/2 hours. During the test runs, the tools used to determine steady state included the Notes Server SHOW command, the child driver RES files, and Domino Server statistics output to the server console on a minute-by-minute basis. To confirm steady state, we verified the number of users, the number of transactions per minute, and the mail-routing log at the SUT. We confirmed steady state when the:

- Number of users on the SUT Notes Server console did not drop below the number of connected users
- Pending mail did not become backlogged, as seen from the mail-routing log at the SUT.

To ensure that the test results were reproducible, all tests were repeated, and the results were compared for consistency.


Other NotesBench Tests

Other Lotus NotesBench tests, such as WebWalker, WebBuyer and Calendar and Scheduling are planned for future disclosure reports.

Data

IBM PC Server 704 NotesMark Value for Mail-Only Test

The Mail workload was run for approximately 8-1/2 consecutive hours (including startup and shutdown activities). The IBM PC Server 704 system demonstrated that it can support 2,850 concurrent active users with this workload. The NotesMark throughput value was 3,761. Average response time was .624 seconds.





The Mail workload executes Notes transactions that model a server for mail users at sites that rely only on mail for communication. The resulting capacity metric for a mail-only server is the maximum number of users that can be supported before the average user response time becomes unacceptable.

The mail-only test script models an active user who is reading and sending mail. The script contains an average of 15 minutes of waiting; thus, the average user would execute this script a maximum of four times each hour. For each iteration of the test script, there are 5 documents read, 2 documents updated, 2 documents deleted, 1 view scrolling operation, 1 database opened and closed, 1 view opened and closed, and some miscellaneous operations. In sending messages, each user sends a mail message to NumMessageRecipients no more frequently than every 90 minutes.



IBM PC Server 704 - NotesMark Value for MailDB Test

The MailDB workload was run for approximately 8-1/2 consecutive hours (including startup and shutdown activities). The IBM PC Server 704 system demonstrated that it can support 2,050 concurrent active users with this workload. The NotesMark throughput value was 4,697. Average response time was 1.599 seconds.





The MailDB workload models a server for active users who are performing only mail and simple shared database operations. The test includes mail-only activity plus view operations in a shared database and navigation of unread documents in a shared database. The test applies especially to sites that rely primarily on mail for communication or that have Notes users who do not yet use all the Notes features. The throughput for this test is a capacity metric. It indicates the maximum number of active users that can be supported before the average user response time becomes unacceptable.

The MailDB script models an active user who is reading mail, sending mail and reading a shared database. It contains an average of 15 minutes of waiting; thus, an average user will execute this script no more frequently than four times per hour. For each iteration of the script, there are 8 documents read, 2 documents updated, 2 documents deleted, 4 view scrolling operations, 2 databases opened and closed, 2 views opened and closed, and some miscellaneous operations. In sending messages, each user sends one mail message to NumMessageRecipients approximately once every 90 minutes.



Analysis

When configured optimally as described in this disclosure, the PC Server 704 with the PC ServeRAID SCSI Adapter has demonstrated that it can manage the intense resource usage during ramp-up to as many as 2,850 concurrent Mail-only users with minimal recoverable errors at the clients. This was achieved without applying excess processor resource, which is left idle after ramp-up. As can be seen in the following PERFMON chart captured in a trial run for the Mail-only test, average processor utilization during ramp-up did not significantly rise above average processor utilization after ramp-up.

Conclusions

The test results demonstrate that an IBM PC Server 704 configured as described within this report can support 2,850 Mail-only users and 2,050 MailDB users with a response time well below what the test criteria permit. These results are based on running the IBM PC Server 704 as a dedicated Domino server; the addition of other application workloads will affect the number of users supported as well as the response time. Achieving optimum performance in a customer environment is highly dependent upon selecting adequate processor power, memory and disk storage as well as balancing the configuration of that hardware and appropriately tuning the operating system and Domino software.

These results demonstrate that the IBM PC Server 704 system provides leadership performance as a hardware platform for the Domino Server environment.

Appendix A: Overall Test Setup and Software Versions

Number of Client Systems

Fifteen driver systems were used. Fourteen of those systems were configured as child drivers (child 1 through child 14). One system was configured as the parent (source driver).

The child systems were IBM PC 350 computers, each configured with one 150MHz Pentium processor, 80MB of memory, one 1.12GB hard disk, and one Intel EtherExpress 10/100 PCI TX Adapter.

The disk configuration used for the child systems is as follows:

C: Partition (12MB - FAT) - DOS 6.3 and Network Client for DOS and Windows 3.0 D: Partition (1207MB - NTFS) - Windows NT 3.51 Workstation, Domino Workstation executables and data

Number of Server Platforms

One server platform, the IBM PC Server 704 with two 200MHz Pentium Pro processors and 768MB of memory was benchmarked.

The disk configuration used for the system under test is as follows:

C: Partition (2GB - NTFS) - Windows NT Server Version 4.0 (Boot Partition) Domino executables
D: Partition: Unused
E: Partition (20GB - NTFS) - Domino data

The disk configuration used for destination servers 1, 2 and 3 is as follows:

C: Partition (500MB - NTFS) - Windows NT Server Version 4.0 (Boot Partition) D: Partition (1650MB - NTFS) - Domino executables E: Partition (8600MB - NTFS) - Domino data

Network

A single 100Mbps Ethernet LAN segment was used. Two 12-port Bay Networks BayStack 201 100BaseT Hubs were used to connect the servers and clients to the LAN segment.



Appendix E: Network Configuration

The standard TCP/IP stack provided by Microsoft Windows NT Server 4.0 was used.

In the system under test, the network adapter speed for the IBM 100/10 Ethernet PCI Adapter was changed from the default 'Auto' to 100Mbps. This forced the Duplex Mode to 'Half'.

In addition, under 'Advanced' configuration options for the Ethernet adapter, the following three parameters were changed from their default values at the destination servers:

- Coalesce Buffers = 16
- Receive Buffers = 32
- Transmit Control Block = 32
