

IBM 8272 Nways Token-Ring LAN Switch

General description

The IBM 8272 Nways™ Token-Ring LAN Switch provides high-speed forwarding of Token-Ring traffic among the shared hubs or dedicated Token-Ring workstations attached to each of the 8272 ports. The 8272 creates multiple, concurrent paths among the connected segments, each supporting a full 16-Mbps of Token-Ring bandwidth.

The 8272 is available in two models. Model 108 provides eight, fixed RJ-45 ports and has one slot for installation of an optional Universal Feature Card (UFC). Model 216 has 16, fixed RJ-45 ports and two UFC slots. UFCs provide additional Token-Ring ports (up to 24 total), high-speed uplink ports and RMON.

Both models are stand-alone units with integrated power supplies, and can be rack- or surface-mounted.






