Restarting secondary servers

If you are running Infoprint Manager for AIX 4.1 on servers running the AIX 5.x operating system, you must manually restart any Infoprint Manager AIX secondary servers. This situation occurs whenever a secondary AIX server system shuts down, whether because of system failure or planned maintenance.

If you are migrating to AIX 5.x systems from an earlier level of AIX, you may not need to perform this task. You can check by viewing the /etc/rc.nfs file and checking to see if the line /usr/sbin/mount all appears towards the bottom of the file. If it is not there, you do the following to restart your secondary servers:

- 1. On each secondary server, specify the following at an AIX command line: /usr/sbin/mount all
- 2. Manually restart each of the secondary servers.

Infoprint Manager server restriction

You cannot run Infoprint Manager server (**pdserver**) processes within the same Infoprint Manager system (namespace) if they are at different levels. This restriction means that Infoprint Manager server processes must be at the same PTF level (for example, 4.1.0.40). If they are at different levels, they are not likely to function properly.

Server software prerequisites

You are required to have installed AIX Version 4.3.3 ML009 or higher.

To ensure correct operation, Infoprint Manager requires that certain components of the AIX operating system be installed on your RS/6000 system. It is up to you to install the base level of these components from your AIX product CD-ROMs before starting the Infoprint Installer for Version 4.1 to add service updates.

If you want to install the non-DCE version of the Infoprint Manager base, we recommend that you simply run the Infoprint Installer. If you are missing any of the required base AIX filesets for Version 4.1.0, the Installer will list them and direct you to install them from your AIX product CD-ROMs.

If you want to install the Advanced Security/Scalability feature of the Infoprint Manager base, there are additional requirements. We strongly recommend that you install all the DCE filesets that are required for Infoprint Manager Version 4.1.0 prior to running the Infoprint Installer. You can find a list of the required DCE filesets in the Infoprint Manager for AIX: Introduction and Planning Guide.

To make the installation as easy as possible, the Infoprint Installer will automatically apply service to your AIX software to meet Infoprint Manager prerequisites. This service is needed to ensure that Infoprint Manager will function properly. Be advised, however, that the Installer will not automatically apply service that is hardware specific.

Accessing the Publications CD-ROM

Use the following procedure to access the publications CD-ROM:

- 1. Insert the Publications CD-ROM in your CD-ROM drive. It starts automatically.
- 2. From the pulldowns for all choices, select **Open the collection index**.
- Click OK.
- 4. Because this change does not take effect until you re-insert the CD-ROM, open the CD-ROM drive and then close it.
- 5. The CD-ROM now opens to the opening page of the publications in pdf
- 6. Scroll down the list of publications, and select the one you want to view.

Viewing the Publications CD-ROM

The contents of the publications CD are best viewed using Netscape Navigator Version 4.7 or higher, or Internet Explorer Version 5.0 or higher. Adobe Acrobat Reader Version 3.0 can be used to view most PDF files on the CD; however, for larger files, such as the Infoprint Manager: Reference, Acrobat Reader Version 4.0 or higher is required. To download Acrobat Reader, visit the Adobe Web site at http://www.adobe.com.

Creating AFP Upload actual destinations from the command line

If you are creating actual destinations for AFP Upload printers, use the "Creating a PSF upload-SNA-attached actual destination" and the "Creating a PSF upload-TCP/IP-attached actual destination" topics in "Chapter 9. Creating and managing actual destinations" of the Infoprint Manager for AIX: Getting Started manual. The current version of the Infoprint Manager for AIX: Procedures, (G544–5813–01) manual's "Creating an actual destination for AFP Upload and print" topic will point to the Infoprint Manager for AIX: Getting Started manual the next time that book is published.

Close both Infoprint Manager Administration GUI and Infoprint Manager Operations GUI before installing any Infoprint Manager PTF

Be sure to close the Infoprint Manager Administration GUI and the Infoprint Manager Operations GUI before installing any Infoprint Manager PTF to avoid problems with files that need to be replaced.

Ensure that the Infoprint Manager server and the Infoprint Manager Administration and Operations GUIs are at the same level

Ensure that the Infoprint Manager server is at the same level or at a higher level of service than the Infoprint Manager Administration GUI or the Infoprint Manager Operations GUI. Otherwise, you may receive error messages like: 5010-625 Cannot recognize attribute...

Note: For this to occur, the Infoprint Manager Administration GUI or the Infoprint Manager Operations GUI would have to be running on a different workstation than the Infoprint AIX server. This situation might occur if you install a new version of a GUI on a workstation and point to a downlevel Infoprint AIX server.

Limited user-exit support for Fax and Email DSS

Fax and Email destinations support only the input data stream and output data stream user exits.

Ensure Infoprint Manager for AIX runs with ksh88

The core of the AIX system is designed to run with **ksh88**. The Infoprint Manager server runs as root. While you can have users running with **ksh93**, you should not change the shell for root; it needs to be **ksh88**.

Chapter 12, "Gathering accounting and auditing data about print jobs"

The PSF accounting user exit enhancements that were included as part of the Infoprint Manager for AIX Version 4.1 release require clarification. A new procedure has been added to the Infoprint Manager Administration GUI to show you how to activate the default PSF ainuxjobcompletion accounting logs. The ainuxjobcompletion accounting exit interface can be used for PSF-driven IPDS printers. It provides actual (versus projected) accounting data and provides additional information about completed print jobs.

Customers who migrate from an existing V3.2 Infoprint Manager server to Infoprint Manager V4.1 will continue to find the previous accounting exit interface

intact. Accounting programs that count on the previous accounting interface, which includes the IBM supplied samples, will function without modification.

Customers installing a Infoprint Manager V4.1 server for the first time will see the post-print accounting exit activated and the accounting data will be written to /var/psf/jobcompletion.log.

The intent is to minimize migration issues for existing customers, but to start new customers out with the preferred accounting exit. The default installation for new machines will not activate both accounting exits. However, when V4.1 is installed, both new and migrated customers can choose to have the old, preferred, or both accounting exits active.

If a migrating installation wants to activate the preferred (new) exit, the administrator must set the psf-post-print-accounting-program-name auxiliary sheet attribute in the appropriate auxiliary sheet object to provide the name of either the IBM supplied sample exit or a custom version of the preferred exit. The administrator may also choose to deactivate the old exit by resetting the value of the psf-exit-program-name auxiliary attribute in the appropriate auxiliary sheet object to <not set>.

If a new installation wants to deactivate the preferred exit and instead run the old exit, the administrator must reset the psf-post-print-accounting-program-name auxiliary sheet attribute in the appropriate auxiliary sheet object to <not set>. The administrator may also choose to activate the old exit by setting the value of the psf-post-print-accounting-program-name auxiliary sheet attribute in the appropriate sheet object to the name of either the IBM supplied sample exit or a custom version of the old exit.

In both cases, the administrator may also choose to have both exits active by setting the psf-exit-program-name and the psf-post-print-accounting-programname auxiliary sheet attributes to the names of the two accounting programs (old and preferred). The administrator may also choose to deactivate both exits by leaving both attributes unset.

Accounting reports provide structured information

When you collect accounting data, you can review it in raw format in the accounting logs, or you can use the Infoprint Manager utilities for accounting reports to format the information into a more readable format. The three accounting report utilities that were added to support the preferred job completion accounting are described in the Infoprint Manager: Reference in "Chapter 2, Infoprint Manager Tools." Here is a list of the job completion accounting report utilities:

DCE pthread information

Infoprint Manager requires only one DCE pthread fileset on the server: **dce.client.rte.pthreads**. For Infoprint Manager for AIX 4.1.0, this fileset must be at fix level 3.1.0.4 or higher. The DCE pthreads code is included on the Infoprint Manager Server CD, and the update happens automatically during the installation.

If you are running a full implementation of DCE, there are many filesets that might have to be updated in addition to this pthreads fileset. You should have the DCE media available, and you should ensure that the DCE implementation is at 3.1 or higher before starting the installation of Infoprint Manager.

If you are not using DCE, the only fileset that you need is the dce.client.rte.pthreads fileset. In a previous update to Infoprint Manager, additional DCE client code might have been installed along with the pthreads code. This client code is not necessary, and it should be removed rather than updated. In every case that IBM is aware of, the additional file set is dce.msg.en_US.pthread.rte. This fileset should be uninstalled using the following command entered on the command line:installp -u dce.msg.en_US.pthread.rte. After this fileset is uninstalled, the Infoprint Manager installation should proceed normally.

There may be situations when you do not want Infoprint Manager to use I printer-resident fonts. If you do not have customized GRID files and want to use the 'no resident' version of the sample grid files shipped with Infoprint Manager, complete the following procedure: 1. From the AIX command line: cd /var/psf/PrinterName Where *PrinterName* is the name of the Infoprint physical printer that represents the actual printer device. 2. Create the charset.grd file from the charset.grd.nores file: cp /usr/lpp/psf/grd/charset.grd.nores charset.grd 3. Support for Xerox printers that use Line Conditioned Data Stream (LCDS) and metacode available Together with a separately installed PRPQ, the July 2004 PTF enables Infoprint Manager to process LCDS and metacode. Infoprint Manager sends the resulting data streams to Xerox printers over a TCP/IP connection. the name of the PRPQ is IBM Infoprint LCDS and Meta Driver for AIX PRPQ (5799-GYT). The metacode function is described in its own stand-alone publication entitled Infoprint LCDS and Meta Driver for AIX: Installation and User's Guide (which is available with the metacode i-listed PRPQ), while the new attributes and values for the Infoprint metacode support are described in the Infoprint Manager: Reference. Additions to the parameter list passed from the mysprsd daemon to the shell script: The Infoprint mvsprsd daemon passes a parameter list for each data set it receives to the Infoprint MVS Download shell script. This parameter list was expanded as part of the work done to support the IBM Infoprint LCDS and Meta

Driver for AIX PRPQ (5799-GYT). Items 4 through 7 in the following parameter list were added. A description of all the items in the parameter list is provided here: 1. The name of the downloaded data set in the format: MVS_system_name.job_name.dataset_name.forms_name.yyddd.hhmmsstABCD.PRD where: *MVS_system_name* Specifies the name of the MVS system that downloaded the data set. job_name Specifies the name of the job containing the data set. dataset_name Specifies the name of the data set. forms_name Specifies the name of the form identified with the MVS FORMS parameter. yyddd Specifies the year followed by the number of the day of the year. hhmmsstABCD Specifies the time the data set was received in hours, minutes, seconds, tenths of a second, hundreds of a second, thousands of a second, and hundred thousands of a second. PRD Specifies the type of file that contains print data. PRD is the suffix used by PSF for AIX, Infoprint Manager for AIX, or Infoprint Manager for Windows NT and Windows 2000 servers to identify the data file received and other information needed to create the final print job. 2. The print-options string, which is a series of options and values. When you specify the -k flag with the mvsprsd command, Infoprint also stores the options in a file whose name is in the following format: MVS system name.job name.dataset name.forms name.yyddd.hhmmsstABCD.JCL where all the qualifiers in the name are the same as those for the name of the data set, with the exception of JCL. The -k flag specifies that the file contains print options. 3. The logical printer name, which was specified with the -q flag of the Infoprint mvsprsd command when the daemon was started. 4. Always empty. 5. Always empty. **6**. The port from the **-p** option of the **mvsprsd** command. 7. Additional exit parameters from the **-X** option of the **mvsprsd** command. Support formsize specification

The July 2004 PTF includes support that allows operators and end users for IPDS continuous forms printers that support the IPDS X0H SMS command (such as the IBM 6400 Printer with IPDS coax feature V3R3 or higher) to specify a job medium extent (form length), rather than having to make the change at the hardware printer console. This function enables MVS Download jobs to honor the FORMLEN JCL parameter with 6400 printers. This support includes the following:

- The **form-length** document/default document attribute has been added.
- The form-length-range-supported actual destination and logical destination attributes have been added.

For more information on **form-length** and **form-length-range-supported**, see Infoprint Manager: Reference.

Note: The formsize specification support must be used with PSF for z/OS APAR OA07109.

The sap2afp transform includes Simplified Chinese and Traditional Chinese language support and SAPGOF data generated from SAP SmartForms support

The July 2004 PTF adds Simplified Chinese and Traditional Chinese support to the **sap2afp** transform.

With OTF jobs, code page support is flexible because OTF jobs use specific fonts. When an OTF job calls for a font, the sap2afp transform compares the specified font name and point size in the OTF job with entries in the fonts.tab table, and if a match is found, a new AFP character set and AFP code page are selected.

When the sap2afp transform processes an ABAP job, the defcp.tab table is loaded to map single-byte ASCII to EBCDIC code points. sap2afp calls the iconv utility for double-byte code point matching. sap2afp processes the pagedef.tab file and matches the value for the PJPAPER parameter in the ABAP file to an entry in the pagedef.tab to determine which character sets to use in normal and bold mode. Therefore, all the ABAP jobs sent to a given Infoprint Manager server use the same code page with different character sets possible depending on the value selected with the **PJPAPER** parameter in the ABAP print job.

Enabling multi-byte character sets for Simplified Chinese Fonts on AIX: The sap2afp transform supports the use of double-byte character sets (DBCS) through the use of the iconv utility on AIX. To use this support, you must run the SAPGOF (or a compatible) device type on an SAP R/3 system at Release 4.0A or higher.

To enable this support, an Infoprint Manager AIX administrator must perform the following procedure:

- 1. Obtain and install the selected Simplified Chinese AFP fonts required for printing.
- 2. Ensure that the iconv utility is installed on the Infoprint Manager system where the **sap2afp** transform is running.
- 3. Create a backup copy of the current /usr/lpp/psf/sap2afp/defcp.tab file.
- 4. Copy the /usr/lpp/psf/sap2afp/defcp.tab.spchinese file to the /usr/lpp/psf/sap2afp/defcp.tab file.
- 5. Create a backup copy of the current /usr/lpp/psf/sap2afp/pagedef.tab file.
- 6. Copy the /usr/lpp/psf/sap2afp/pagedef.tab.spchinese file to the /usr/lpp/psf/sap2afp/pagedef.tab file.

Note: When you have completed this procedure to enable multi-byte character sets, you may choose to modify the pagedef.tab or fonts.tab to specify a different set of fonts.

Enabling multi-byte character sets for Traditional Chinese Fonts on AIX: The sap2afp transform supports the use of double-byte character sets (DBCS) through the use of the iconv utility on AIX. To use this support, you must run the SAPGOF (or a compatible) device type on an SAP R/3 system at Release 4.0A or higher.

To enable this support, an Infoprint Manager AIX administrator must perform the following procedure:

- 1. Obtain and install the selected Traditional Chinese AFP fonts required for printing.
- 2. Ensure that the iconv utility is installed on the Infoprint Manager system where the sap2afp transform is running.
- 3. Create a backup copy of the current /usr/lpp/psf/sap2afp/defcp.tab file.
- 4. Copy the /usr/lpp/psf/sap2afp/defcp.tab.tdchinese file to the /usr/lpp/psf/sap2afp/defcp.tab file.
- 5. Create a backup copy of the current /usr/lpp/psf/sap2afp/pagedef.tab file.
- 6. Copy the /usr/lpp/psf/sap2afp/pagedef.tab.tdchinese file to the /usr/lpp/psf/sap2afp/pagedef.tab file.

Note: When you have completed this procedure to enable multi-byte character sets, you may choose to modify the pagedef.tab or fonts.tab to specify a different set of fonts.

The July 2004 PTF also updates the sap2afp transform to support SAPGOF data generated from SAP SmartForms.

IPP gateway added to Infoprint Manager for AIX

Infoprint® Manager for AIX now includes an Internet Printing Protocol (IPP)¹ gateway. The IPP gateway allows users anywhere in the network who have IPP client software installed to submit print jobs through Infoprint Manager, even to printers that are not IPP-enabled. Users must follow the instructions provided with the IPP client to add a printer to their desktops. Use the **startippgw** utility or SMIT (Infoprint Printing Systems → Infoprint Utilities → IPP Gateway Daemon) to enable the IPP gateway.

Note: For information on the **startippgw**, **stopippgw**, and **lsippgw** daemon utilities available to use with the IPP Gateway on AIX, see the Infoprint Manager: Reference.

An Internet Printing Protocol (IPP) gateway printer is a printer that you create on a client workstation using IPP client software. Users submit print jobs to that printer, and they are sent to Infoprint Manager through the Infoprint IPP gateway. The IPP gateway can then send the job on to any Infoprint printer, even those that are not IPP-enabled.

^{1.} The Internet Printing Protocol (IPP) is an application protocol that uses the Hypertext Transfer Protocol (HTTP) to allow you to print your documents to any IPP-enabled printer whose web address (or Uniform Resource Identifier-URI) you know. You can use IPP to send print data over both LANs and the Internet, so users who are directly connected to your LAN, as well as those who work remotely, have access to the same printers.

I **Printing through the IPP Gateway:** The IPP gateway is a daemon in Infoprint Manager that allows you to print using IPP even if you don't have an IPP-enabled printer, as long as you (and your users) have IPP client software installed on your workstation.

- 1. Start the IPP Gateway using the startippgw daemon utility or SMIT (Infoprint Printing Systems → Infoprint Utilities → IPP Gateway Daemon).
- 2. Verify that the gateway is working. Open your Internet browser and enter the following web address, replacing serverhostname with the DNS hostname of the system where the IPP gateway daemon is running:

http://serverhostname:631/printers

where 631 is the default port. If you are using a different port, specify the number of the port you are using. If the gateway is working correctly, you will see a list of the printers that are available through the gateway. All of your Infoprint destinations should be listed. Find the address (URI) of the destination you want your users to print to.

If you don't have a DNS name server running on your network, replace serverhostname with the dotted-decimal IP address of the system where the IPP gateway daemon is running.

If your Infoprint Manager environment has two Infoprint Manager systems in different name spaces on the same machine, you need to start an IPP gateway daemon for each Infoprint Manager system.

3. Provide your end users the IPP client software to install on their workstations or laptops and give them the address (the URI from step 1) of the printer they should use. When the end users have completed the installation of the IPP client software, they can print to the printer just as they would print to any other printer.

Windows 2000 systems come with IPP client software built in. Users on other Windows platforms can download IPP client software. The Printer Working Group, the organization that is leading the development of IPP, provides a list of IPP client software that you can use to find the appropriate client at http://www.pwg.org/ipp/IPP-Products.html.

Line data using OpenType fonts now supports using the Byte Order Mark (BOM) and little endian data

With the July 2004 PTF, Infoprint Manager can process the Unicode Byte Order Mark (BOM) when printing line data with OpenType fonts. (For UTF8 or UTF16-BE data, the BOM is skipped and not printed. For UTF16-LE, the data is reversed to BE before it is printed, and the BOM is not printed.) In addition, Infoprint Manager can now recognize multi-byte carriage-return and line feed characters when parsing Unicode line data.

This support allows you to process UTF8 and UTF16 line data in either little-endian or big-endian order using a traditional line data or record-format page definition. As many Windows and AIX editors default to UTF8 or UTF16LE encodings and automatically insert a BOM at the beginning of the file, you can now print documents created with these editors using Unicode-enabled Open Type Fonts.

Mixed mode data is line data mixed with MODCA structured fields. You can use mixed mode data with UTF8, UTF16LE, and UTF16BE with a BOM as long as the BOM is the first bytes (following any cc or trc bytes) of the first line of data.

If you want to mix UTF8 or UTF16BE data with other data encodings, you can do that if there is **no** BOM. In this case, the font selected for the data tells Infoprint Manager the data encoding. You can't do this with UTF16LE data because it always requires a BOM.

This new support includes a **-o newlineencoding** flag for the **-o** flag, a stream,(newline=characters,encoding) value for the fileformat flag on the line2afp transform, and a new-line-option-data-encoding document/default document attribute. For more information on this new support, see Infoprint Manager: Reference.
