




An Ageing Population

70+ and 80+ age group as a percentage of the total population



 Strategic approach delivering business outcomes. Not tactical.



Architectural Principles




Key Principles:

- 1 Data is validated against reference data prior to loading the Integrated Data Repository
- 2 Data from disparate sources are integrated/consolidated into a divisional data model
- 3 Data is summarised into reporting formats designed to improve reporting performance and functionality
- 4 You can drill through from summarised data to the lower level transactions that make it up
- 5 Security at a data and user level






