So now what?

Server consolidation is not about combining many servers into a single footprint

Blade servers and SANs provide a great way to get multiple servers into a rack

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Decision Process

- Inventory existing functions
- Determine platform that function is currently implemented on
- Inventory existing skills and skill availability
- Determine customer preference (if any) for platform
- Consider strengths / limitations of individual functions/platforms
- When the function is available on all platforms need to look at what sub-components are needed when considering the decision.



Take an Inventory of the Existing Environment

Windows/Linux

For each server:

- size of processor and number of processors
- CPU utilization
- applications/services installed
- hard disk size, protection and utilization
- I/O rates (# of disk operations per second)
- high availability schemes used
- number of users

iSeries

For each server:

- model and processor feature
- release level
- ► # of disk arms
- # I/O towers
- tape device
- available slots
- CPU utilization
- disk capacity and utilization

Best Server Replacement Targets

You need to look for server functions that match the benefits

- mission critical, line of business applications
 - -hot spare, testing, backup and recovery
- heavy I/O applications
 - -storage Virtualization
- like to like function servers (file servers)
 - storage Virtualization, latest xSeries technology
- infrastructure servers (DNS, DHCP, WINS, DC)
 - storage Virtualization, latest xSeries technology, user admin.



Strategies

- One recommended strategy would be to start with a pilot to help customer through the issues and decision making (for Linux purposes).
 - User Administration will be single biggest concern/prohibiter to moving to Linux
- Rather then bring in new function to existing infrastructure
 consider new function for implementation in Linux or IXS/IXA.

Disk arms

- for every 100 disk ops per sec you need at least 1 arm
- minimum 3 arms to start with

Tips & Techniques

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Pre-install Checklist - Windows Integration

- Do you have a supported xSeries model?- goto www.ibm.com/eserver/iseries/windowsintegration/daxsmodels.html
- ► Does the xSeries model require a Remote Supervisor Adapter (RSA) option (P.N. 09N7585) to attach to iSeries?
 - X235 & X255 require a RSA
 - X440, X360, X250, X350 & NetFinity 7100 & 7600 DO NOT require a RSA
- What will the HSL loop configuration be?
 - ► Is this a new loop?
 - If existing loop, do you have capacity on the loop?
 - ▶ If other I/O towers on loop, make sure you place xSeries in middle of loop.
 - Do not place next to Migration towers.
- Do you have the necessary HSL & SPCN cables?
 - ▶ If a new loop, you will need an HSL cable for each IXA + 1.
 - ▶ If adding to an existing loop you will need an HSL cable for each IXA.
 - ▶ If placing xSeries in a rack, get the shortest HSL cables, 3m (1460 feature) for between the IXAs.
 - ▶ You may need longer HSL cables to and from iSeries to IXAs.
 - You will need a SPCN cable for each IXA.
 - ▶ If placing xSeries in a rack, get the shortest SPCN cables, 2m (1463 feature) for between IXAs.

You may pendulinger SPCN cables to and from iSeries to IXAs

xSeries Server Preparation

- The boot fail counter and virus detection need to be turned off before installing the IXA card. This is done from Setup utility.
- Upgrade xSeries server BIOS to the latest level goto www.pc.ibm.com/support to get latest BIOS.
- Upgrade xSeries Advanced Systems Management Firmware goto www.pc.ibm.com/support to get latest version of firmware.



IXA Card Installation

- ► Make sure power is unplugged from xSeries Server
- ► IXA card must be place in correct slot for each supported xSeries Server goto iSeries PCI Card Installation Instructions to find current instructions.
- ► Jumpers need to be set for certain models of xSeries Servers to provide 3.3v standby power, goto iSeries PCI Card Installation Instructions to find current instructions goto http://publib.boulder.ibm.com/iseries/v5r2/ic2924/info/rzame/eng47451.pdf.
- Power down iSeries
- Connect HSL & SPCN cables to IXA
 - Keep all SPCN, HSL and Interconnect cables 6" away from any power source or power cables
- Reconnect xSeries power cables
- ▶ Power on iSeries, do NOT power on xSeries server, it will be powered on by iSeries
- You will notice the LED's on the IXA flashing, BE PATIENT SPCN code is being downloaded, then xSeries Server will be powered on. This can take up to 1/2 hour.
- ► After iSeries & xSeries are powered on, you may want to have the SPCN network renumbered by doing an option 33 from the OPs Panel. This can be done from any point in time.
