This guide gets you started with a typical installation for IBM Classification Module.



Product overview

IBM[®] Classification Module is an enterprise platform for a wide range of applications that require unstructured content to be automatically categorized. Examples of such applications include document classification and taxonomy automation within Enterprise Content Management (ECM) systems, e-mail classification and routing, auto-response and archive tagging, records class and retention policy assignment for records management, and Web self-service solutions.

Embedded with natural language processing capabilities, the Classification Module determines the true intent of long-form text and helps you leverage that information in decision making. Unlike other classification systems that are based on rules only, the Classification Module is based on text analysis and incorporates real-time learning that adapts to changing business needs and becomes more accurate over time.



The following diagram shows a typical architecture for a high-scale environment that includes IBM Classification Module and the optional IBM FileNet® P8 integration.





Step 4: Install IBM Classification Module

Run the appropriate installation program for your environment:

- AIX[®]: ./icm85_setup_aix.bin
- Linux[®]: ./icm85_setup_linux.bin
- Solaris: ./icm85_setup_sunos.bin
- Windows[®]: icm85_setup_win32.exe

5 Step 5: Optional: Install Integration for IBM FileNet P8

IBM Classification Module provides automatic classification services for IBM FileNet P8. To install the integration for IBM FileNet P8, run the appropriate installation program for your environment. In a high-scale production environment, you might want to install this software on a separate computer from where you install the Classification Module core components:

- AIX: ./icm85_setup_aix.bin
- Linux: ./icm85_setup_linux.bin
- Solaris: ./icm85_setup_sunos.bin
- Windows: icm85_setup_win32.exe

Select the **Custom** installation type, select **IBM FileNet P8 integration**, and follow the instructions in the installation wizard.
