About the Installation Guide for Enterprise Search

Use this book to help you install $DB2^{\textcircled{m}}$ Information Integrator OmniFind Edition (enterprise search).

With DB2 Information Integrator OmniFind Edition, you can allow users to search across data throughout your enterprise. This technology is called enterprise search. The enterprise search components are installed when you install IBM® DB2 Information Integrator OmniFind Edition. The term *enterprise search* is used in the documentation for DB2 Information Integrator OmniFind Edition unless references are made to CD labels or specific product components.

This book does not provide specific information about how to install DB2 Universal Database products, WebSphere Application Server Network Deployment products, or fix packs. See the documentation for those products for installation information.

Who should read this book

Read this book if you want to install enterprise search components on one or more servers. You should understand how to configure your operating system and have the privileges and authorities of a system administrator. You should review the documentation for DB2 Universal Database and WebSphere Application Server before you install those products. They are prerequisite products for enterprise search.

Chapter 1. Required software and supported data sources

Before you install DB2 Information Integrator OmniFind Edition (DB2 II OmniFind Edition), ensure that you have the required software and a supported operating system.

Supported operating systems

DB2 Information Integrator OmniFind Edition (enterprise search) is supported on the following operating systems:

- AIX® 5L
 - 5.2 (requires Maintenance Level 4 and the August 2004 C++ Runtime for AIX PTF)
 - 5.3 (requires Maintenance Level 1 and the August 2004 C++ Runtime for AIX PTF)
- LinuxTM
 - Red Hat Enterprise Linux Advanced Server Version 3.0, Update 2, kernel 2.4.21-9.ELsmp (requires libstdc++3.2.3-34)
 - SuSE Linux Enterprise Server 8 with Service Pack 3 (UnitedLinux SP3) (requires libstdc++3.2.2-38)
 - SuSE Linux Enterprise Server 9 with Service Pack 1 (UnitedLinux SP1) (requires libstdc++-3.3.3-43.28)
- Microsoft® Windows
 - Microsoft Windows[®] 2000 Advanced Server
 - Microsoft Windows 2003 Enterprise Edition

To download the AIX PTF:

- 1. Go to the IBM Software Support site for the August 2004 C++ Runtime for AIX PTF.
- 2. Download the xlc.rte.60.aug2004.ptf.tar.Z file. Follow the instructions on the Web page to uncompress, untar, and install the PTF.
- 3. Apply the appropriate maintenance levels for your version of AIX. Go to the following Web site to download AIX fixes: www.ibm.com/servers/eserver/support/pseries/aixfixes.html. Follow the instructions on the Web page to uncompress, untar, and install the PTF.

Required software for the DB2 II OmniFind Edition (enterprise search)

Enterprise search requires the following software:

IBM DB2 Universal Database Enterprise Server Edition, Version 8.2DB2 UDB Enterprise Server Edition serves as a repository for collected data.

Optional: IBM DB2 Universal Database Information Center, Version 8.2 The DB2 Information Center provides information for DB2 II OmniFind Edition (enterprise search), DB2 Information Integrator, and DB2 Universal Database. If you do not install the information center, when you click a help topic, you will be connected to an IBM Web site that hosts the information center. The information center does not include PDF files.

IBM DB2 Universal Database Run-time Client, Version 8.2

The DB2 Run-time Client is required only if you install DB2 II OmniFind Edition on multiple servers.

IBM WebSphere Application Server, Version 5.1 with Fix Pack 1 (5.1.1)

This software includes a Web application server and the IBM HTTP server. The fix pack is not included with DB2 II OmniFind Edition.

IBM WebSphere Application Server Deployment Manager, Version 5.1 with Fix Pack 1 (5.1.1)

Deployment Manager is required to allow WebSphere to run multiple copies of itself in the same system. The fix pack is not included with DB2 II OmniFind Edition.

Required levels of Java

IBM Software Development Kit for JavaTM 1.3.x or 1.4.x. (SDK for Java 1.5 is not supported)

The SDK for Java is required to compile the Java search applications that are created with the enterprise search application programming interfaces (APIs). These SDKs for Java are not required to install DB2 II OmniFind Edition (enterprise search). The enterprise search ESSearchApplication sample and the data listener samples should be compiled with SDK for Java 1.4.x. The SIAPI samples can be compiled with either 1.3.x or 1.4.x.

The ESSearchApplication in the *ES_INSTALL_ROOT*/samples directory must be compiled with IBM SDK for Java, Version 1.4.x and must execute in a JRE Version 1.4 environment. WebSphere Application Server and WebSphere Portal both provide the JRE Version 1.4.

Supported data sources

You can use enterprise search to create searchable collections from the following data sources. Some of these data sources require additional software. See "Required software for data sources" on page 3 for more information:

DB2 Content Manager, Version 8.2 or 8.3

Accessed with the Content Manager crawler.

DB2 Universal Database for Linux, UNIX, and Windows, Version 8.1 and 8.2 Accessed with the DB2 crawler.

DB2 Universal Database for z/OS, Version 7 or later

Accessed through DB2 Information Integrator, Version 8.2 or later with the DB2 crawler.

Documentum 4.3 or 5.2.5

Accessed with the VeniceBridge crawler (WebSphere Information Integrator Content Edition, Version 8.2).

FileNet Paragon CS 5.3

Accessed with the VeniceBridge crawler (WebSphere Information Integrator Content Edition, Version 8.2).

Hummingbird DM 5.1

Accessed with the VeniceBridge crawler (WebSphere Information Integrator Content Edition, Version 8.2).

Informix IDS, Version 9 or later

Accessed through DB2 Information Integrator, Version 8.2 or later with the DB2 crawler.

Lotus Domino, Version 5.0 or later, Version 6.0 or later

Lotus Domino Server 5.0.9a or later is supported. Accessed with the Notes crawler.

Microsoft SQL Server 2000

Accessed through DB2 Information Integrator, Version 8.2 or later with the DB2 crawler.

Microsoft Exchange Server 2000 or 2003

Accessed with the Exchange Server crawler.

Oracle 9i and Oracle 10g

Accessed through DB2 Information Integrator, Version 8.2 or later with the DB2 crawler.

Required software for data sources

To crawl Lotus[®] Domino[®] or Notes databases, DB2 Content Manager databases, federated relational databases, or VeniceBridge sources, install the following versions of these products:

IBM Lotus Domino Server 6.0.2 or later for Linux and AIX or Lotus Notes 6.0.2 or later for Windows

This software is required if you plan to collect data from Lotus Notes or Domino sources. The Notes crawler for NRPC uses Domino libraries as a Lotus Notes client. You install these libraries by installing Lotus Domino Server on the enterprise search crawler server. To ensure that the Notes crawler can work with the Domino libraries, you run a setup script that DB2 II OmniFind Edition provides on the crawler server after you install the Domino libraries.

IBM DB2 Information Integrator for Content, Version 8.2 for Windows and AIX or IBM DB2 Content Manager Toolkit, Version 8.2 for Linux

For enterprise search on AIX and Windows, the Content Manager crawler uses the Java[™] connector for Content Manager, Version 8 to access DB2 Content Manager servers. You install this connector by installing IBM DB2 Information Integrator for Content, Version 8.2 for Windows and AIX on the crawler server. To ensure that the Content Manager crawler can work with DB2 Content Manager, you run a setup script that DB2 II OmniFind Edition provides on the crawler server after you install the connector.

For enterprise search on Linux, the Content Manager crawler uses the Java connector for Content Manager, Version 8 to access DB2 Content Manager servers. You install this connector by installing the IBM DB2 Content Manager Linux Toolkit, Version 8.2 on the crawler server. To ensure that the Content Manager crawler can work with DB2 Content Manager, you run a setup script that DB2 II OmniFind Edition provides on the crawler server after you install the connector.

IBM WebSphere Information Integrator Content Edition, Version 8.2.1 with hot

The VeniceBridge crawler uses Java libraries of WebSphere Information Integrator Content Edition as a Java client. You install these libraries by installing WebSphere Information Integrator Content Edition on the crawler server. To ensure that the VeniceBridge crawler can work with the Java libraries, you run a setup script that DB2 II OmniFind Edition provides on the crawler server after you install the WebSphere Information Integrator Content Edition libraries.

If you plan to search FileNet CS or Hummingbird data sources, you must download and install a WebSphere Information Integrator Content Edition hot fix for each. For FileNet CS, install APAR JR21417. For Hummingbird, install APAR JR21708. See the WebSphere Information Integrator Content Edition Support Web site for information about installing the hot fixes.

The VeniceBridge product was renamed to WebSphere Information Integrator Content Edition.

IBM DB2 Information Integrator, Version 8.2 or later

DB2 Information Integrator, Version 8.2 is shipped with DB2 II OmniFind Edition. You can use DB2 Information Integrator to crawl relational databases from DB2 Universal Database for z/OS, Informix IDS, and Oracle 9i and Oracle 10g.

Hardware and disk space requirements for DB2 II OmniFind Edition

Hardware and disk space requirements depend on your operating system and your intended use for DB2 II OmniFind Edition (enterprise search).

Hardware requirements

Disk space requirements can vary depending on the number of documents that you want to crawl and the types of data sources that you crawl. These requirements assume that you build indexes regularly, which means that new documents are added, removed, or updated in the index. For a multiple server configuration, the space requirements affect the index server. The *ES_NODE_ROOT* directory requires the most disk space on your system.

The following list describes the minimum hardware requirements and minimum disk space requirements for a single server configuration and a multiple server configuration:

Small solutions

Single server configuration:

- 2 or more processors: 2.0 GHz or more for Intel and AMD; 1.5 GHz or more for RISC
- 4 6 GB of RAM (Add 1 to 2 GB of RAM for each additional active collection.)
- 200 GB of disk space based on 1 000 000 documents in one or more collections with an average document size of 20 KB

Medium solutions

Four-server configuration:

- 2 or more processors: 2.0 GHz or more for Intel and AMD; 1.5 GHz or more for RISC
- 4 6 GB of RAM on each server
- 2 TB total disk space based on 7 000 000 documents in one or more collections with an average document size of 20 KB

Large solutions

Four-server configuration:

- 4 or more processors: 2.0 GHz or more for Intel and AMD; 1.5 GHz or more for RISC
- 8 GB of RAM on each server (4 GB of RAM for Windows)
- 6 TB total disk space based on 10 000 000 documents in one or more collections with an average document size of 20 KB

Chapter 2. DB2 II OmniFind Edition fix pack installation

DB2 II OmniFind Edition fix packs are cumulative if no supported operating systems are added in fix pack releases. You can usually install the latest fix pack without installing previous fix packs.

Before you begin

It is recommended that you back up your system before you install a fix pack.

About this task

DB2 II OmniFind Edition, Version 8.2.2 is an upgrade installation only. You must have an existing version of DB2 II OmniFind Edition before you can install version 8.2.2.

You can upgrade to version 8.2.2 from version 8.2 or from version 8.2.1. However, for AIX 5.3 and SuSE Linux Enterprise Server 9, you must first install version 8.2.1 (the full installation). Then, install version 8.2.2 (fix pack installation). See "Installing DB2 II OmniFind Edition, Version 8.2.2 on AIX 5.3" on page 8 and "Installing DB2 II OmniFind Edition, Version 8.2.2 on SuSE Linux 9" on page 9. You cannot use the silent installation for SuSE Linux 9.

You can install fix packs with the graphical installation, text mode installation, or silent installation (in most cases). To use the silent installation, read the fixpack.rsp file, which is at the root of the DB2 II OmniFind Edition image. You can also uninstall DB2 II OmniFind Edition silently with the uninstall.rsp file.

See the DB2 Information Integrator OmniFind Edition Installation Guide for Enterprise Search, Version 8.2.1 for information about how to install version 8.2.1.

Procedure

For Windows installations, ensure that you have administrator authority. To install DB2 II OmniFind Edition, Version 8.2.2:

- 1. Log in as the root user.
- 2. Start the Installation Launchpad:
 - On AIX from a command prompt, type ./install-aix.bin
 - On Linux from a command prompt, type ./install-linux.bin
 - On Windows, double-click the file install-win32.exe or from a command prompt, type install-win32.exe.
- 3. Specify the same information from the previous installation if prompted.

 Use the same user name and password for the enterprise search administrator that you created when you installed version 8.2 or version 8.2.1. Do not select **Create a user**.

Installation and data directories

When you install DB2 II OmniFind Edition, the installation program creates two main directories: the installation directory and the data directory.

Installation directory

In the documentation, *ES_INSTALL_ROOT* represents the installation directory. The installation directory contains files such as executable files and default files that do not change when the system is running. You can change the default *ES_INSTALL_ROOT* directory, but for a multiple server installation, use the same installation directory path (*ES_INSTALL_ROOT*) for all servers.

Data directory

In the documentation, *ES_NODE_ROOT* represents the data directory on the server. The data directory contains files such as configuration files and data files that the system updates regularly. Dedicate the largest file partition or disk space on your system to the data (*ES_NODE_ROOT*) directory.

Table space directory

On the crawler server, the table space directory is installed in the data directory by default. You can specify another location for the table space during installation. This directory must have access to a large amount of disk space.

Enterprise search administrator user ID and password

The enterprise search user ID and password must be valid on the operating system and have the authority to access and configure DB2 Universal Database.

During the DB2 II OmniFind Edition installation, you can enter an existing enterprise search administrator user ID and password or allow the installation program to create one for you. When you use an existing user ID and password, the installation program might modify the authority and privileges for that user ID so that the enterprise search administrator can properly run the system.

The enterprise search administrator user ID and password must be the same on each server in a multiple server installation.

Installing DB2 II OmniFind Edition, Version 8.2.2 on AIX 5.3

Because AIX 5.3 was added to the DB2 II OmniFind, Version 8.2.2 (Fix Pack 2) list of supported operating systems, you must first install version 8.2.1 (full installation). Then, install the upgrade version (8.2.2).

You can allow the DB2 II OmniFind Edition, Version 8.2.1 installation program to install prerequisite software for you, or you can install it manually. If you allow the installation program to install it, you must have the CDs or installation images available when you install DB2 II OmniFind Edition.

Procedure

To install DB2 II OmniFind Edition, Version 8.2.2 on AIX 5.3:

- 1. Create a user name and password on AIX. This user name and password will be used for the enterprise search administrator when you install DB2 II OmniFind Edition. This user must be a member of the DB2 group db2grp1.
- 2. Install DB2 II OmniFind Edition, Version 8.2.1 (full product) and the perquisite software unless prerequisite software is already installed. To start the Installation Launchpad, type ./install-aix.bin

Use the same user name and password that you created on the operating system for the DB2 II OmniFind Edition (enterprise search) user. Do not select **Create a user** because the user name and password already exist in the system. See the DB2 Information Integrator OmniFind Edition Installation Guide for Enterprise Search, Version 8.2.1 for complete installation instructions.

3. After you install version 8.2.1, install DB2 II OmniFind Edition, Version 8.2.2 (fix pack). See Chapter 2, "DB2 II OmniFind Edition fix pack installation," on page 7.

Installing DB2 II OmniFind Edition, Version 8.2.2 on SuSE Linux 9

Because SuSE Linux Enterprise Server 9 was added to the DB2 II OmniFind Edition, Version 8.2.2 (Fix Pack 2) list of supported operating systems, you must first install version 8.2.1 (full installation). Then, install the upgrade version (8.2.2).

You must install the following prerequisite software if you do not already have it. The DB2 II OmniFind Edition cannot install the prerequisite software for you.

- DB2 Universal Database Enterprise Server Edition, Version 8.2
- WebSphere Application Server, Version 5.1 and Fix Pack 1
- WebSphere Application Server Deployment Manager (Network Deployment), Version 5.1 and Fix Pack 1

Procedure

For a single server installation, install the following software on one server. To install and configure prerequisite software and DB2 II OmniFind Edition, Version 8.2.1 on four servers, follow these steps. You must install and configure both search servers in the same way.

- 1. Install DB2 Universal Database Enterprise Server Edition, Version 8.2 on the crawler server. See the DB2 Information Center for installation instructions. Use the installation option for the default DB2 instance creation (dasusr1, db2inst1, db2fenc1).
- 2. Optional: Install the DB2 Information Integrator Information Center, Version 8.2 on both search servers. Use the default settings. See the DB2 Information Center on the Web for installation instructions: http://publib.boulder.ibm.com/infocenter/db2help/index.jsp.
- 3. Install WebSphere Application Server, Version 5.1 on both search servers. See the WebSphere Application Server Information Center for instructions.
- 4. Install WebSphere Application Server Deployment Manager, Version 5.1 (Network Deployment) on both search servers. See the WebSphere Application Server Information Center for instructions. The WebSphere Application Server Deployment Manager installation must be federated on both search servers. To federate:
 - a. Run the following commands:

 $/ {\tt opt/WebSphere/DeploymentManager/bin/startManager.sh}$

/opt/WebSphere/AppServer/bin/addNode.sh localhost 8879 -includeapps

/opt/WebSphere/AppServer/bin/startNode.sh

/opt/WebSphere/AppServer/bin/startServer.sh server1

b. In a Web browser, open the WebSphere Application Server administration console by going to the following URL: http://computer name:9090/admin

- c. From the left navigation pane, click **Environment** → **Update Web Server Plugin**.
- d. In the right window pane, Click **OK**.
- e. Save the configuration by clicking Save from the top menu bar.
- f. Log off from WebSphere Application Server administration console.
- g. Ensure that the following file exists: /opt/WebSphere/DeploymentManager/config/cells/plugin-cfg.xml.
- h. Edit the /opt/IBMHttpServer/conf/httpd.conf file. Change the value of WebSpherePluginConfig to /opt/WebSphere/DeploymentManager/config/cells/plugin-cfg.xml.
- i. Run the following command: /opt/IBMHttpServer/bin/apachectl start
- j. In a Web browser, go the following URL: http://computer_name/snoop. Verify that this Web page displays correctly.
- k. Run the following set of commands:

/opt/IBMHttpServer/bin/apachectl stop

/opt/WebSphere/AppServer/bin/stopServer.sh server1

/opt/WebSphere/AppServer/bin/stopNode.sh

/opt/WebSphere/DeploymentManager/bin/stopManager.sh

- 5. Install WebSphere Application Server, Version 5.1 Fix Pack 1 (5.1.1) and WebSphere Application Server Deployment Manager, Version 5.1 Fix Pack 1 (5.1.1) on both search servers. See the DB2 Information Integrator OmniFind Edition Installation Guide for Enterprise Search, Version 8.2.1 for installation instructions.
- 6. Install the DB2 Run-time Client, Version 8.2 on the index server. The single server installation does not require a DB2 client. See the DB2 Information Center for installation instructions.
- 7. Install DB2 II OmniFind Edition, Version 8.2.1. Insert the CD or copy the installation image to each server. After you start the Installation Launchpad, specify which server (crawler, index, or search) that you are installing. See the DB2 Information Integrator OmniFind Edition Installation Guide for Enterprise Search, Version 8.2.1 for complete installation instructions.
- 8. After you install version 8.2.1, install DB2 II OmniFind Edition, Version 8.2.2 (fix pack). See Chapter 2, "DB2 II OmniFind Edition fix pack installation," on page 7.

Chapter 3. Starting First Steps

After you install DB2 II OmniFind Edition, you can use the First Steps program to verify the installation, open documentation, or start the system. You can start First Steps by selecting the check box on the last window of the installation program or start it manually.

Procedure

To start First Steps manually on Linux or AIX, log on as the enterprise search administrator and type:

export DISPLAY=display_server_host_name:0.0

firststep.sh

To start First Steps manually on Windows, click the First Steps shortcut from the **Start** menu or double-click the executable file firststeps.bat in the *ES_INSTALL_ROOT* directory.

Chapter 4. Starting DB2 II OmniFind Edition on Linux and AIX

After you install DB2 II OmniFind Edition on Linux and AIX, the installation program will start the prerequisite software for you. However, if these software components are not started, you can start them manually.

Before you start enterprise search, ensure that DB2 Universal Database, the HTTP server, Deployment Manager, and WebSphere Application Server are running. If the prerequisite software or DB2 II OmniFind Edition is not running, follow these steps:

- 1. On the crawler server, start DB2 Universal Database:
 - a. Log in as the root user.
 - b. Type db2start
- 2. On both search servers, start the IBM HTTP server:
 - a. Log in as the root user.
 - b. Change directories to /opt/IBMHttpServer/bin/
 - c. Type ./apachectl start
- 3. On both search servers, start Deployment Manager:
 - a. Log in as the root user.
 - b. Change directories to /usr/WebSphere/DeploymentManager/bin
 - c. Type ./startManager.sh
- 4. On both search servers, start WebSphere Application Server:
 - a. Log in as the root user.
 - b. Change directories to /opt/WebSphere/AppServer/bin
 - c. Type
 - ./startNode.sh
 - ./startServer.sh server1

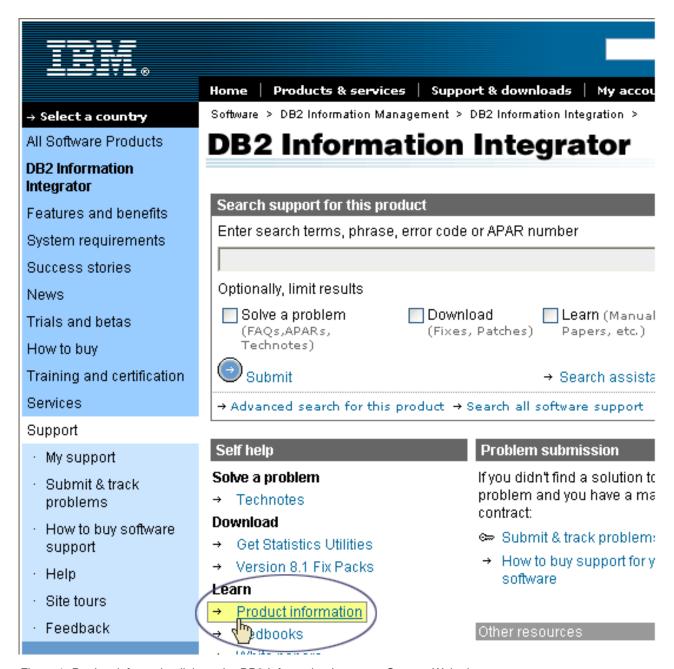


Figure 1. Product information link on the DB2 Information Integrator Support Web site
