Product overview

IBM® **Business Process Manager (BPM) Banking Pack** version 7.5 is a set of prebuilt, industry-specific assets for the **IBM Business Process Manager Express**, **Standard**, and **Advanced** editions. The BPM Banking Pack integrates seamlessly with the IBM BPM components and provides a variety of assets that help accelerate and enhance BPM solution delivery.

The BPM Banking Pack is also extensible and open for configuration and customization based on the key business needs of the organization. BPM solutions based on the BPM Banking Pack can help enterprises to better understand, automate, and optimize their processes, support changing business needs, and increase their competitive edge.

The **BPM Banking Pack** provides the following assets for core banking, payments, and customer care for banking institutions:

- Banking Capability Models: The Banking Capability Models are based on American Productivity & Quality Center (APQC)-Process Classification Framework (PCF), International Organization for Standardization (ISO) 20022, and IBM best practices. The Banking Capability Models are used to provide a view of business capabilities and business processes used in the banking industry.
- **Banking Process Models:** The Banking Process Models are based on IBM best practices. The Banking Process Models are the foundation for implementation of a banking-specific BPM solution, enabling it to be reused across multiple solutions.
- Banking Service Models: The Banking Service Models are based on IBM Industry Models called Information FrameWork (IFW) and IBM best practices. The Service Models are prebuilt service interfaces and schemas that facilitate interoperability across diverse platforms for the banking industry. These industry standards provide the messaging schemas that can be used to define the Industry Service Interfaces.
- Banking Common Components: The Banking Common Components are based on ISO 20022 Single Euro Payments Area (SEPA), National Automated Clearing House Association (NACHA), and IBM best practices. The Banking Common Components include common services that can be used as-is or can be customized to enable transactional functions.
- **Banking Business Vocabulary:** The Banking Business Vocabulary is based on IFW. The Banking Business Vocabulary is used to provide more information about the relationships between industry-specific terms. The Banking Business Vocabulary is a taxonomy of the business terms for the banking industry.
- Banking Business Object Models: The Banking Business Object Model is based on ISO 20022 and IBM best practices. The Banking Business Object Models is a logical representation of business entities and attributes that set up a business domain or a sub-vertical within a domain.
- Banking Solution Scenarios: The Banking Solution Scenarios are out-of-box packaged BPM implementation as a reference to understand end-to-end delivery of a BPM solution for the banking industry. The Banking Solution Scenarios use most of the assets from the BPM Banking Pack and customize them further as required.

The BPM Banking Pack also provides the asset navigator tool that allows you to search and browse the various assets provided in the 7.5 installation.
