Welcome to the Release Notes for IBM® WebSphere® Lombardi Edition for Microsoft® SharePoint Add-on 7.2.0.

Lombardi for SharePoint ships with several Microsoft SharePoint web parts that enable you to add Lombardi process information to corporate or personal SharePoint sites. This flexibility ensures that you can effectively maintain, manage, and analyze WebSphere Lombardi Edition tasks and process instances from any Microsoft SharePoint 2007 portal. See the section *Lombardi for SharePoint process portal web parts* in the *Lombardi for SharePoint 7.2.0 User Guide* for more information.

Using Lombardi for SharePoint, you can complete the following tasks from a SharePoint site:

- Launch Lombardi processes.
- View and perform assigned tasks from WebSphere Lombardi Edition.
- Manage in-flight Lombardi processes, including starting and stopping process instances, viewing process diagrams, and reassigning tasks to balance workload.

What's new in Lombardi for SharePoint 7.2.0

IBM® WebSphere® Lombardi Edition for Microsoft® SharePoint Add-on 7.2.0 introduces the following features and enhancements.

• Lombardi for SharePoint 7.2.0 uses the InstallShield installer instead of the InstallAnywhere installer used for Teamworks for SharePoint 2007.

What's changed in Lombardi for SharePoint 7.2.0

This release of IBM® WebSphere® Lombardi Edition for Microsoft® SharePoint Add-on 7.2.0 introduces the following changes to WebSphere Lombardi Edition compatibility and administration.

• The Lombardi Software BPM product names have changed for this release. Teamworks is now IBM WebSphere Lombardi Edition. Teamworks for SharePoint 2007 is now IBM® WebSphere® Lombardi Edition for Microsoft® SharePoint Add-on 7.2.0, also known as Lombardi for SharePoint.

WebSphere Lombardi Edition and Lombardi for SharePoint provide enhanced capabilities to the IBM WebSphere portfolio.

- The minimum supported release of WebSphere Lombardi Edition is 7.2.0.
- The collaboration function is not supported.

Teamworks for SharePoint 2007 supported group collaboration when installed with Teamworks 7 or Teamworks 6 Enterprise. This collaboration feature is not supported in Lombardi for SharePoint 7.2.0.
