1. Overview

The integration allows access Logiscope functionalities from Microsoft Visual C++ .NET graphical environment.

This integration is available for C and C++ Visual C++ projects.

A Visual C++ project shall be considered as a C project if it contains only C source files. A Visual C++ project containing at least one C++ source file shall be considered as a C++ project.

Once the integration is installed it is possible to:

- Build and visualize *QualityChecker* results (e.g. source code metrics, components complexity rating) from the Microsoft Visual C++.NET graphical environment.
- Check rules and visualize violations from the Microsoft Visual C++.NET graphical environment.
- Build instrumented binaries (for coverage analysis) from the Microsoft Visual C++.NET graphical environment.
- Launch Logiscope Studio for a more comprehensive use of Telelogic Logiscope Toolset.
- Edit the configuration file for default settings (for instance the set of rule to check).

The integration has been developed and tested with :

- Microsoft Visual C++ .NET 2003 (Microsoft Development Environment 2003 Version 7.1.3088).
- Microsoft Visual C++ .NET 2005 (Microsoft Development Environment 2005 Version 8.0.50727.42).

Known Limitations:

• The Logiscope integration does not work properly when running 2 distinct instances of Microsoft Visual C++.NET in parallel.

2. Installation

Before using the **Telelogic Logiscope Microsoft Visual C++**.**NET** integration, you have first to install it.

- Launch the installer from the Microsoft Windows Start menu: Program Files / Telelogic / Telelogic Lifecycle Solutions Tools / Telelogic Logiscope 6.5 / Visual C++ .NET Integration / Installation
- 2. One of the following windows appears:
 - If only one version of Visual C++ .NET is installed on the computer:

• If more than one version of Visual C++ .NET is installed, choose the Visual C++ .NET environments in which you want to install the integration:



- 3. Choose the options you want to install (by default everything is installed):
 - Logiscope Studio : if checked, the corresponding menu item "Logiscope Studio" will be added into the Tools menu of Visual C++ .NET, which will allow you to start Logiscope Studio from Visual C++ .NET environment.

- Edit Logiscope configuration file : if checked, the corresponding menu item will be added into the Tools menu of Visual C++ .NET, which will allow you to edit the configuration file directly within Visual C++ .NET. The configuration file is used to set default values which are used to create Logiscope projects.
- **Build Logiscope RuleChecker results** : if checked, the corresponding menu item will be added into the Tools menu of Visual C++ .NET, which will allow you to check rules on a Visual C++ project directly from Visual C++ .NET environment.
- **Build Logiscope QualityChecker results** : if checked, the corresponding menu item will be added into the Tools menu of Visual C++ .NET, which will allow you to make a quality analysis of a Visual C++ project directly from Visual C++ .NET environment.
- **Build Logiscope Instrumented binary** : if checked, the corresponding menu item will be added into the Tools menu of Visual C++ .NET, which will allow you to build an instrumented binary, for coverage analysis, from a Visual C++ project directly from the Visual C++ .NET environment.
- 4. Click on Install for the integration to be installed.

3. Using Logiscope from Visual C++

3.1. Building Logiscope QualityChecker Results

Before using this functionality, the project must be cleaned in order to force a full rebuild, or new Configuration created for the project (to do so use the Configuration Manager of Microsoft Visual C ++). The configuration may be called Logiscope.

Once this has been done, activate the menu "Tools/Build Logiscope QualityChecker Results" from Visual C++. The build starts and Logiscope is activated. Logiscope creates a new Logiscope project during the build and produces the *QualityChecker* results. Once the build is finished the following text appears within the output window of Visual C++:



The directory where the *QualityChecker* report has been generated is indicated, and a link to this report is available, using Ctrl+Click on the link will open the *QualityChecker* report of the project in a Microsoft Visual C++ .Net window.

During the build the following files/directories are created:

- <project_name>_audit.ttp located into the project directory is the Logiscope project corresponding to the Visual C++ project being processed.
- <*target_directory*>/*Logiscope_audit* is the Logiscope repository containing intermediate files produced by Logiscope.
- <target_directory>/Logiscope_audit/audit_c for C project or
 <target_directory>/Logiscope_audit/audit_cpp for C++ project is the Logiscope repository containing the HTML report.

3.2. Building Logiscope RuleChecker Results

Before using this functionality, the project must be cleaned in order to force a full rebuild, or new Configuration created for the project (to do so use the Configuration Manager of Microsoft Visual C ++). The configuration may be called Logiscope.

Once this has been done, activate the menu "Tools/Build Logiscope RuleChecker Results" from Visual C++. The build starts and Logiscope is activated. Logiscope creates a new Logiscope project during the build and produces the RuleChecker results. Once the build is finished the following text appears in the output window of Visual C++:

Each violation of a rule is listed and a double click on it opens the source file on the appropriate line allowing immediate modification of the source file.

Scrolling down to the end of the output window will show the following text:



A link to the rule violations report is available, using Ctrl+Click on the link will open the RuleChecker report of the project in a Microsoft Visual C++ .Net window.

During the build the following files/directories are created:

- <project_name>_rule.ttp located into the project directory is the Logiscope project corresponding to the Visual C++ project being processed.
- <*target_directory*>/*Logiscope_rule* is the Logiscope repository containing intermediate files produced by Logiscope.
- <target_directory>/Logiscope_rule/rchk_c for C project or
 <target_directory>/Logiscope_rule/rchk_cpp for C++ project is the Logiscope repository containing the html report.

3.3. Building Logiscope Instrumented binary

Before using this functionality, the project must be cleaned in order to force a full rebuild, or a new Configuration created for the project (to do so use the Configuration Manager of Microsoft Visual C ++). The configuration may be called Logiscope.

Once this has been done, activate the menu "Tools/Build Logiscope Instrumented binary" from Visual C++. The build starts and Logiscope is activated. Logiscope creates a new Logiscope project during the build and produces an instrumented binary for coverage analysis.

During the build the following files/directories are created:

- <project_name>_test.ttp located in the project directory is the Logiscope project corresponding to the Visual C++ project being processed.
- <target_directory>/<target_name> is the instrumented binary build. Please refer to

TestChecker documentation for its usage.

Note: The default instrumentation library which comes with Logiscope (*<install-dir>/instr/lib/vlgtc.lib*) is compiled using the Multi-Threaded model (the Single-Threaded model is no longer supported by Visual C++ .NET 2005). If the application to instrument should be a Single-Threaded one you would need to build a new library using the source file *<install-dir>/instr/src/vlgtchk.c* and reference the newly built library using the configuration file (see 3.5 Edit Logiscope configuration file).

3.4. Launching Logiscope Studio

Once a Logiscope project has been built, a more comprehensive examination of Logiscope results may be achieved by launching Logiscope Studio. Logiscope Studio allows to go deeper in the exploitation of the produced Logiscope data and in turn to start Logiscope Viewer for a deep quality analysis or TestChecker for running tests and coverage analysis.

To start Logiscope Studio from Microsoft Visual C++ .NET graphical environment activate the menu "Tools/Logiscope Studio".

If more than one Logiscope project have been built from the same Microsoft Visual C++ project, for instance a RuleChecker and a TestChecker project, a dialog pops up to ask which one has to be open. This dialog looks like:

Click on the kind of project you want to open with Logiscope Studio.

3.5. Customizing the integration

To customize the integration, you can edit the configuration file in Microsoft Visual C++ .NET environment.

Mainly, this file used to setting up:

- the C or C++ dialect for parsing code.
- the default quality model used by *Logiscope QualityChecker* for quality evaluation, default is the Logiscope.ref file delivered with the standard Logiscope distribution in the Ref folder.
- the default rule set(s) used by Logiscope RuleChecker for rule checking.
- the default support library used by *Logiscope TestChecker* to instrument source code under test.
