

# ISPF Option 10 is SCLM

## **Highlights**

Provides a high function Software Configuration Management (SCM) solution for OS/390 and z/OS

Fully integrated with ISPF, a non-priced feature of OS/390 and z/OS

## Overview


Are you looking for a library manager or software configuration manager for OS/390 or z/OS? You could have them and not even know it! Software Configuration and Library Manager (SCLM) offers application developers and project administrators the tools they need to develop and manage software projects. SCLM's library management capabilities allow you to manage your source code, perform versioning and auditing and manage the promotion of your data from one set of libraries to the next. SCLM's configuration management capabilities track how all of the pieces of your application fit together and ensure that your inputs and outputs are always in synch. SCLM is a feature of Interactive System Productivity Facility (ISPF) and is included with the OS/390 operating system. If you already have OS/390, then you have SCLM.

### Integrated with ISPF

SCLM provides developers with an easy-to-use interface for developing and maintaining programs.

If you are using ISPF today, then you already know how to use some of the key functions of SCLM. Your application data is kept in a hierarchy of libraries. All your favorite ISPF Edit features are fully integrated with SCLM including edit highlighting and edit compare. The rest of what happens during an SCLM Edit is behind the scenes. This includes member locking and the automatic discovery and recording of include dependencies. Member statistics such as number of lines of code are also recorded. All of this is done without the user ever knowing.

Additional functions that you will see in SCLM are Build, Promote and a number of utilities.



### Build

Build is the term that SCLM uses for the process of translating inputs into outputs. SCLM provides a smart build capability that can determine which affected members from an application need to be re-built. You don't have to remember what modules to recompile when you change an include or copybook -- SCLM knows. Rather than regenerate the entire application, SCLM will only perform the compiles and link edits that are necessary for the change.

#### **Promote**

Promote is the SCLM term for moving an object or an application from one set of libraries to the next. The synchronization of inputs and outputs is verified before the Promote takes place. SCLM will not allow the application to be moved unless the outputs were generated from the inputs.

## Utilities

The SCLM auditing and versioning capabilities track changes to the application throughout its life cycle. The audit information includes what function was performed when and by whom. Versions can be maintained for any non-load (record format U) application data. The Audit and Version Utility allows you to view the audit information for a member, recover versions and compare the content of one version to another.

The SCLM Library Utility member list provides a single interface to the key SCLM functions, similar to what you find in other areas of ISPF. From a single panel, you can browse, view, edit, build or promote. You can also look at the control information for a member.

SCLM includes a Migration Utility to help you easily move your application data under SCLM control. Other utilities are available for generating a variety of reports.

#### **Your Data**

SCLM stores all of your application data in partitioned data sets. The SCLM control information is stored in VSAM. SCLM does not use any proprietary file structures. In addition, SCLM does not update the application data itself. SCLM does not rely on 'footprints' in the application outputs to ensure that the application objects remain in synch. SCLM uses RACF, the ISPF configuration table and its VSAM control information to limit access to the application data.

### Customization

SCLM is highly customizable. Samples are provided for most of the common programming languages and additional languages are easy to add. A number of User Exit points are available which allow you to integrate SCLM with other products and customize SCLM for your needs.

## Use with the SCLM Suite

The SCLM Suite is IBM's webbased tool set that includes SCLM, IBM Breeze for SCLM for z/OS and IBM Cloud 9 for SCLM for z/OS. Breeze provides a web-based package approval tool for SCLM. Cloud 9 is a web-based developer's workbench for SCLM.

## Add Tivoli Information Management for z/OS

Add Tivoli Information Management for z/OS to extend the capabilities of SCLM and the SCLM Suite even further. SCLM provides a sample interface to Tivoli Service Desk/390 for verifying change information stored in Tivoli's problem or change management database before allowing a member to be modified in SCLM. The sample interface can be extended for additional integration and a complete software change and configuration management solution.

## WebSphere Studio Asset Analyzer for z/OS

Add WebSphere Studio Asset Analyzer for z/OS to maintain and extend existing assets residing in SCLM through impact analysis, connector build assistance and application understanding. Information about the artifacts from SCLM is stored in a DB2 database that can be shared across development teams or the enterprise and accessed through a web browser.
