- Linked value across IBM collaboration portfolio






IBM Collaboration Toolkit






More than editors through a browser

Live Sections afford greater flexibility in how documents are created, shared and managed

- Documents are a collection of live sections, not just a monolithic static file
- Fine grain co-editing controls
- Assign and manage ownership at the section level
- Reuse of section content
 - Search for sections to reuse
 - Clip sections
 - Use either link or copy semantics
 - Provenance and traceability
 - Where did this section come from?
 - Link back to original source


