## Why Migrate?...New Functionality



- Take advantage of new functionality in WebSphere MQ version 7
  - WMQ version 7 "JMS Release"
    - Central requirement was to improve JMS implementation
      - But it also leads to enhancements for ALL applications
    - Integration and Extension of publish/subscribe capabilities
      - Designed with Message Broker in mind
    - Easier programming in any environment
      - Some features suggested by JMS requirements are useful in MQI
    - Administration model and APIs natural evolution of existing interfaces

### Background

- Application Compatibility
  - Goal:
    - application built on the present version of WebSphere MQ to continue to work, without migration, on future versions of WebSphere MQ
- Migration Types:
  - Queue manager
  - WebSphere MQ client
  - Application
  - Operating Environment
- Migration might really mean system replacement in your environment
  - This a perfectly valid (perhaps even preferred?) approach







- General Preparation
  - Understand (and verify) what needs to be tested and what's likely to be impacted
  - Catalog your system environment
    - Current version levels of MQ and OS
      - For queue managers and WMQ client systems
    - Installed
      - SupportPacs
      - Customizations (user exits)
      - APARs
    - Co-resident and interacting software versions
    - Distributed queueing topology
      - Clusters
      - Channel security





- General Preparation
  - Catalog your applications environment
    - Language and runtime environment dependencies
    - Messaging patterns
    - Messaging models
      - Point to point (classic queueing)
      - PubSub
    - Transactional environment
    - Interacting systems and software

- General Preparation
  - Decide what version to migrate to
    - Default: Target latest maintenance release
      - 7.0.1.4 is (currently) lastest fixpack
      - You definitely want to target this version
      - ...especially if the migration rollout timeframe is long
      - ...except when you don't
        - » N-1 maintenance strategy
        - » Stake in the ground at another version
    - WebSphere MQ Recommended Fixes

- System Preparation
  - Multiple versions of WMQ on single OS image are not supported
    - Also referred to as Coexistence
    - Except on z/OS
  - Must use WebSphere MQ Server software to install both WebSphere MQ server and client on the same machine
    - Clients SupportPac MQC7
    - MQExplorer SupportPac MS0T

# System Preparation

- Ensure your system meets the software and hardware requirements for WebSphere MQ v7.0
  - See the System Requirements Table:
    - http://www.ibm.com/software/integration/wmq/requirements/index. html
    - Pay particular attention to 32-bit vs. 64-bit options where they exist (Linux, Windows)
    - And to the **Notes!**
- Validate and configure OS resources
  - See Quick Beginnings
  - Shared memory
    - How to configure UNIX IPC resources for WebSphere MQ

- System Preparation
  - Review platform-specific install and uninstall procedures
    - Have software in-hand
      - Base, Fix pack, iFixes for any required APARs
  - Cleanup Activities
    - Cleanup obsolete/unused objects
    - Convert to v6 functionality (e.g. LISTENER instead of inetd)
  - Develop and TEST a backout plan
    - Backup and restore procedures
    - Test the process in staging environments
      - Include fallback testing and planning
        - » how will you recover and/or reconcile state changes in your messaging infrastructure?





- Environment Preparation
  - Verify version requirements of interacting software
    - Application Servers, Transaction Managers, Databases (as Resource Managers), JVM, ... applicable to your environment
    - Pay attention to the detail notes!
  - Virtualization environments?
    - System Requirements
    - Solaris Zones

- Environment Preparation
  - Consider HA environment
    - Cannot failover back to v6 after conversion to v7
  - Multi-Instance queue managers (v7.0.1) vs. HA
    - Multi-Instance queue manager functionality is not equivalent to HA
      - HA provides general coordination (failover) of arbitrary resource groups
    - SupportPac MC91 deprecated
      - But still available
        - » <u>http://www-01.ibm.com/support/docview.wss?rs=171&uid=swg24011869</u>
      - Many of the failover implementation details in MC91 can now be implemented with *native* WMQ features rather than scripted parts of MC91 – see the InfoCenter
      - Directory patching no longer required



## **Migration Steps...Before Migrating**



### BACKUP

- Backup plans should already be implemented to cover other (non-migration) scenarios
  - If they are not, now is the time to develop and test them
- Backup the queue manager (definitions)
  - For example: SupportPac MS03
    - Saves all of the objects (queues, channels, etc) defined in a either local or remote queue manager to a file
    - Allows you to recreate a queue manager (without state)

# Migration Steps...Before Migrating



### BACKUP

- Backup the queue manager state information
  - queue manager must be stopped
  - queue manager and log directories
  - On UNIX's (default):
    - /var/mqm/qmgrs
    - /var/mqm/logs
  - Windows (default):
    - C:\Program Files\IBM\WebSphere MQ\qmgrs
    - C:\Program Files\IBM\WebSphere MQ\logs
    - HKLM\SOFTWARE\IBM\MQSeries\
      CurrentVersion\Configuration\QueueManager
  - Note: Make sure you track down & capture logs and data stored on other file systems



- Identify Obsolete SupportPacs that will need to be removed
  - Per-Platform SupportPacs to be removed are described in Quick Beginnings for ... Migrating to MQ v7.0 specific to each platform
    - MA0Y WebSphere MQ Bridge for HTTP
    - MA0C Publish/subscribe
    - MA0R WebSphere MQ transport for SOAP
    - MA88 WebSphere MQ Classes for Java and JMS
    - MACS Client libraries for AIX (64-bit)
    - MACZ Client libraries for HP-UX (64-bit)
    - MACR Client libraries for Sun Solaris (64-bit)
    - MA6P XA libraries for TxSeries for IPF



- If you are migrating a Publish/Subscribe infrastructure
  - WebSphere MQ version 6 publish/subscribe migration
  - This is a entire topic in itself...
- Use separate clusters for PubSub clusters (clustered TOPICS)
  - PubSub clusters are **fully** interconnected; different model and size constraints than clustered queues



- Assess Impact of v7 Changes and New Functionality
  - JMS architecture changes
  - Shared Conversations
  - 32/64-bit considerations
  - IC72897 (to be included in WMQ v7.0.1.5)
  - WebSphere Application Server v7 migration
- We'll dive into the details of these topics shortly...





- Assess Impact of JMS changes
  - WebSphere MQ classes for JMS have been restructured; new layered architectures
    - Exceptions thrown from different classes
  - RFH2 headers handling for WebSphere MQ Classes for Java changes
    - Queue attribute PROPCTL
    - After upgrading to MQ V7, MQMessage.format inside a base Java V6 application returns incorrect value of "MQSTR" instead of "MQHRF2" when getting JMS messages

  - JMS Exception listeners behave slightly differently



- This section will only cover the highlights and unique steps for migrating to WebSphere MQ v7.0 on each platform

## Get Ready

- Quiesce all applications, channels, queue managers
- (Save queued application messages to disk)\*
- Stop all queue managers and listeners
- Backup queue manager state data (tranlogs, qmgr data)
- Uninstall obsolete SupportPacs
- Uninstall\* existing version of WMQ

### Install

- Install WMQ v7 base or refresh pack
- Install WMQ fixpack
- (Install iFixes or PTFs to address APARs)
- (dltmqlnk)

### Post-install

- Start queue manager
  - Queue manager on-disk upgrade takes place with strmqm
- (SVRCONN channel remediation)\*
- Start listeners AFTER the queue manager





- Migrating clustered queue managers
  - Migrate the full repositories first

    - Upgrading Clustered Queue Managers to v7

        - Recommend maintenance to v6 queue managers as well
  - Staged migrations
    - Mixed clusters often persist for long periods of times
    - Mixed versions for specific application queues permit extended live testing with opportunity for selective fallback
  - Cluster member migration steps (next foil)





### Cluster member Migration Steps:

- 1. Suspend (Remove) queue manager from cluster (Optional)
- 2. Record objects known by this queue manager.
  - DISPLAY CLUSQMGR(\*), DISPLAY QC(\*)
- Record full repositories view of the cluster objects owned by this queue manager.
  - 1. DISPLAY CLUSQMGR(<migrated queue manager name>)
  - 2. DISPLAY QC(\*) WHERE(CLUSQMGR EQ <migrated queue manager name>)
- Stop queue manager.
- 5. Take a backup of the queue manager.
- 6. Install the new version of WebSphere MQ.
- 7. Restart queue manager.
- 8. Check for successful cluster object migration and communication with full repositories
- 9. Check that full repositories still know about the migrated cluster queue manager and its cluster queues.
- 10. Test
  - 1. applications on other queue managers can put messages to the migrated cluster queue manager's queues.
  - 2. applications on the migrated queue manager can put messages to the other cluster queue manager's queues.
- 11. Resume (Reinstate) queue manager into cluster (Optional)
  - 1. RESUME CLUSTER(<cluster name>)
- 12. Monitor the queue manager and applications in the cluster

# **Migration Steps...the Mechanics**

- Windows Platform Notes
  - Uninstall not required (but recommended)
  - Default installation installs only those features previously installed
    - CUSTOM option lets you select the features
  - MQExplorer requires Eclipse (3.3) installation
  - dcomcnfg information must be manually restored following migration
  - Ensure that the IBM WebSphere MQ Service is stopped
  - msiconfig installation logging needs to be set up manually



## **Migration Steps...the Mechanics**



- Unix Platform Notes
  - Uninstall required
    - Except on AIX, but even then... Must remove retired filesets
  - Install with platform-specific installation tool:
    - AIX SMIT, installp, geninstall or the Web-based System Manager
    - HP-UX swinstall
    - Linux rpm (rpm upgrade tools **not** supported)
    - Solaris pkgadd
  - There is no migration path between v7 WMQ 32-bit and 64-bit queue managers on 64-bit Linux platforms that support both versions

## **Migration Steps...After Migration**

- On-disk structures are actually migrated when you <u>start</u> the queue manager
- Start queue manager before you start any WebSphere MQ listener associated with that queue manager
  - Otherwise, you will not be able to start the WebSphere MQ listeners
- channel initiator (SCHINIT) and command server (SCMDSERV) can (should) be put under queue manager control (if 5.3 migration)

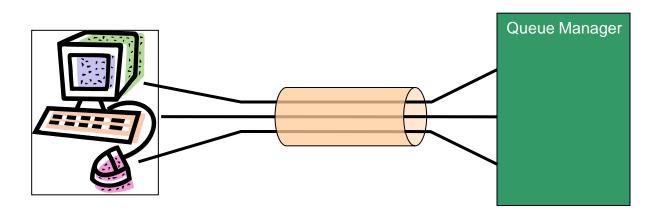

- MQI channels and SHARECNV
  - In WMQ v6 every MQI Connection was implemented over its own separate socket to the QM
  - These were not duplex connections all instigated by the client
  - WMQ v7 can
    - Multiplex multiple connections down the same socket
    - Detect failures much quicker due to fully duplex communications





- MQI channels and SHARECNV
  - New attributes on SVRCONN definitions in v7
    - SHARECNV
    - MAXINST and MAXINSTC
  - SHARECNV
    - Default is 10
    - Attribute set when queue manager is migrated





- MQI channels and SHARECNV
  - Set SHARECNV attribute on SVRCONN channels as appropriate
  - SHARECNV(0) gives v6 behavior & least performance impact\*
  - SHARECNV(1) allows exploitation of v7 features (admin stop/quisce, heartbeat, read-ahead, asynchronous consumers)

- 32 or 64-bit shared libary considerations
  - Symbolic Link Considerations for 32/64-bit
    - Background
      - /usr/lib symbolic links to 32-bit libraries (.../mqm/lib) were created as a convenience
      - Predates 64bit versions of libraries
      - Maintained for backward compatibility
      - Avoiding dependency became important with availability of 64bit libraries in MQ V6.0.
    - dltmqlnk
      - Must be rerun after each WMQ Refresh Pack or Fix Pack installation

- APAR IC72897
  - Background
    - V6
      - JMS clients received messages in the same codepage in which it was stored on the queue (in other words, the unconverted message)
      - converted message internally using the <u>Java JVM's</u> <u>conversion routines</u> to the codepage required by the application
    - V7 (without the APAR, and/or prior to 7.0.1.5)
      - the queue manager performs the conversion
      - converted message returned to the classes for JMS





- APAR IC72897
  - Original goals of V7 change in behavior (prior to this APAR)
    were to:
    - Be completely transparent to the user
    - Provide some performance gains
    - Conform to the general IBM best practice for data conversion:
      - Request queue manager to do the conversion
      - http://www-01.ibm.com/support/docview.wss?uid=swg27005729
    - Provide additional functionality
      - Data Conversion Exits at the queue manager
  - APAR IC72897 restores V7 default behavior to that of v6





- APAR IC72897
  - WHY change default behavior mid-release?
    - Customer migration issues
      - Queue manager cannot perform requested conversion
        - » e. g. AIX: 1051 -> 1208
      - Unwanted header / structure data conversion takes place
        - » Headers converted that were unconverted using MQ v6
        - » Application issues if they did not check
        - » Messages with header conversion failures no longer delivered
      - Differences in new line characters in conversion performed by a z/OS queue manager
      - Queue managers log files filling up with warning messages
        - » On user-specified format





- APAR IC72897
  - Consequences when applied/included
    - Data Conversion Exits
      - MQMD / Format
      - Conversion exits will not run before the message is sent to the requesting client application
    - Using other queue manager known data formats
      - JMS classes do not contain conversion functionality for CICS,
        IMS headers
      - No longer converted by queue manager

- Migrating to WAS v7 and WMQ v7
  - Very Common Integration Scenario
  - Several ways to get there
  - Lots of niceties to be cognizant of
  - End game (target) is environment with WAS at v7 and WMQ v7
    - Assumption is that you are starting with WAS v6/6.1 and WMQ v6



- Migrating to WAS v7 and WMQ v7

- Migrating to WAS v7 and WMQ v7— Basics
  - Architectural History
    - In WAS V5, the WMQ supported code installed on WAS was a cut-down version of actual WMQ server code
    - In WAS V6, the WMQ supported code installed on WAS was a subset of jar files taken from native WMQ libraries;
      - Starting with WMQ V6.0.2.1, a <u>separate</u> WMQ Resource Adapter (wmq.jmsra.rar) is available for installation on other J2EE compliant application servers (but **NOT** SUPPORTED in WAS)
    - In WAS V7, the WMQ supported code installed on WAS is the WMQ Resource Adapter (wmq.jmsra.rar); this is the same RA as for other J2EEE compliant application servers
    - "Which version of MQ is shipped with WebSphere Application Server?" provides the "components" and version level matrix of WMQ/JMS code installed with WAS, going back to WAS V5:

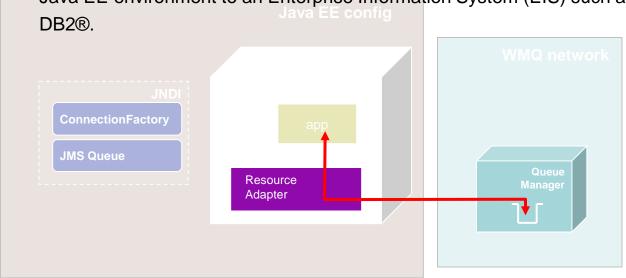


- Migrating to WAS v7 and WMQ v7 Basics
  - WMQ Resource Adapter provides connectivity to WMQ
    - Implements JCA 1.5
  - WMQ RA is a component of WMQ
    - available for other Application Servers since WMQ v6.0.2.1
    - but **not** for WAS
    - Essentially, the RA is a bundled set of the discrete jars needed for JMS client mode connections
      - Plus JCA pieces





- Migrating to WAS v7 and WMQ v7 Basics
  - WMQ Resource Adapter
    - Allows applications running in an application server to access WebSphere MQ resources.
      Supports inbound and outbound communication.
    - Implements the JCA 1.5 interface. The Java Platform, Enterprise Edition (Java EE)
      Connector Architecture (JCA) provides a standard way of connecting applications running in a
      Java EE environment to an Enterprise Information System (EIS) such as WebSphere® MQ or







- Migrating to WAS v7 and WMQ v7 Basics
  - WMQ Resource Adapter
    - Outbound and Inbound (JCA 1.5) Communication types supported
    - Limitations
      - Does not support real-time connections to the Broker
      - Only supports channel exit programs written in Java
      - sslFipsRequired must be true for ALL JCA resources or false for ALL JCA resources
    - If you use the client channel definition table, in the event of a failure the RA might select a different channel definition (and therefore different queue manager) from the CCDT. This could cause issues for transaction recovery.
    - Activation Specifications are now the preferred method for delivering messages from an MQ Destination to an MDB running inside WAS v7.
      - The use of message listener ports has been deprecated in WAS v7
      - It is still possible to use message listener ports to deliver messages to an MDB using the MQ messaging provider.
      - Migration from a Listener Port to an Activation Specification is selective
    - Care needed around 64bit / 32 bit installation (especially if some environments are 64 bit).





- Migrating to WAS v7 and WMQ v7 Basics
  - -Version 6 Levels of WAS and WMQ as starting point
    - Current fixpack levels are WSAS v6.1.0.35 and WMQ v6.0.2.10
    - Default WAS configuration only allows WMQ/JMS client connections to WMQ
      - Default WMQ/JMS Client in WAS 6 is supplied by means of the following jar files:
        - » com.ibm.mqjms.jar
        - » com.ibm.mq.jar
        - » dhbcore.jar
      - Default location in WAS is \$WAS\_install\_root\lib\WMQ\java\lib
    - To establish WMQ/JMS bindings connections to WMQ, you need to install WMQ on the same machine and configure MQ\_INSTALL\_ROOT to point to the WMQ installation directory.

#### Migrating to WAS v7 and WMQ v7 – Target Environment

- WAS and WMQ both at v7
  - Current levels: WAS v7.0.0.15 and WMQ v7.0.1.4
  - WAS V7
    - WebSphere MQ V7 JCA 1.5 RA, installed as a resource adapter, replaces separate client jars
    - MQ\_INSTALL\_ROOT variable is no longer used (except for migration purposes and the client container)
    - Native library path (RA property) is used to identify the location of the required native libraries (for **binding mode** connections)
    - Service updates to RA now solely by use of the WAS FixPacks
      - Manual update possible but only on advice from IBM Service
      - Pushes RA code outside of normal update route





- Migrating to WAS v7 and WMQ v7 Target Environment
  - WAS v7 does not require the 3 WMQ/JMS client jars (used in WAS v6) for any migration scenario
  - All of the WMQ/JMS jar files required in WAS v7 to connect in Client mode to WMQ now come packaged in the WMQ Resource Adapter (WMQ RA).
  - There is only one way to configure the WMQ RA in WAS V7
    - So: MQ\_INSTALL\_ROOT is no longer required and by default it is NOT migrated over from WAS V6.
  - Bindings mode still requires that WMQ v7 is installed on the same machine as the application server

  - Check pre-requisite APAR levels etc. for WMQ in provided documentation
  - Specifically WMQ APAR IC64098 is required to run with WAS v7

- •Migrating to WAS v7 and WMQ v7 Option 1 Upgrade WAS to v7 before upgrading WMQ to v7
  - WAS v7 connects to WMQ using the WMQ RA
  - The WMQ classes for JMS will be running in WAS in "migration mode", which has a performance and functional cost
    - Documented in SupportPac MP07 JMS Performance Evaluation
      - "When connected to a V6 Queue Manager a less optimised codepath is used, which facilitates migration from V6 to V7 but which should not be considered as a long term solution if performance is important."
  - WAS v7 does not support Bindings mode connections to WMQ 6.0.2.4 or earlier (6.0.2.7 required on z/OS)
  - Is a simple but short-term expedient only if performance cost has been confirmed to be acceptable by Business.

- Migrating to WAS v7 and WMQ v7 Option 2 Upgrade WMQ to v7 before upgrading WAS to v7
  - Starting point is WAS 6.1 with WMQ 6 JMS Classes
  - Intermediate point is WAS 6.1 with WMQ v7 JMS Classes
    - This is a valid 'end-point' if it meets business requirements
    - It is stable and supported
  - MQ\_INSTALL\_ROOT will by default point to the WAS directory with the WAS installed WMQ/JMS libraries.
  - Some of WMQ v7's new functionality and improved performance levels are unobtainable with this combination
  - The WMQ Resource Adapter CAN NOT be installed on WAS 6.1





- •Migrating to WAS v7 and WMQ v7 Option 2 Upgrade WMQ to v7 before upgrading WAS to v7
  - Connecting WAS <u>V6.1</u> applications to WMQ (1)
    - For binding mode connections:
      - WebSphere MQ V7 Server must be installed on the same machine as the application server
      - MQ\_INSTALL\_ROOT must be configured to point to the WebSphere MQ V7 installation directory
    - For client mode connections, same configuration as for the starting environment (WAS V6 & WMQ V6)
      - i.e. the cutdown version of WMQ/JMS Client in WAS 6 is supplied by means of:
        - com.ibm.mqjms.jar, com.ibm.mq.jar, dhbcore.jar
      - Which reside by default in WAS\_install\_root\lib\WMQ\java\lib

- Migrating to WAS v7 and WMQ v7 Further Considerations
  - "Target client" WAS v6 field of JMS Destinations
    - In WAS v6, was either 'MQ' or 'JMS', controls RFH2 header generation
    - In WAS v7, property was renamed and the format was changed.
    - Documentation at:

  - PROVIDERVERSION (ConnectionFactory)
    - Possible values: 6, 7, unspecified; usually you want unspecified
    - com.ibm.msg.client.wmq.overrideProviderVersion
    - Documentation in InfoCenter:
      - http://publib.boulder.ibm.com/infocenter/wmqv7/v7r0/index.jsp?topic

- Migrating to WAS v7 and WMQ v7 Further Considerations
  - Many JMS issues resolved between release of WAS v7.0 and current release
    - Latest WAS level recommended as target at the start of the migration project (with the expectation that this will become 'current -1' by completion).
  - Connection to Multi-Instance Queue Managers is supported (WAS 7.0.0.13)
    - Includes WMQ RA 7.0.1.3
  - BEWARE classloader issues if you have embedded MQ jar files
  - WAS v7 migration has its own Migration Guide considerations





- Migrating to WAS v7 and WMQ v7 Further Considerations
  - Key Enhancements
    - Support for Activation Specs with WMQ
    - Better integration with Application Server SSL support
    - Full support for CCDT
    - Support for Channel Exits
    - Improved scripting support
    - Automatic transport selection
