Just by clicking on the Guarani option, the UI is presented in Guarani immediately to allow a preview (changes will be definitive only after "Apply" is clicked).

A confirmation message in Spanish (the current UI language) is shown to inform her of the change and provide a way to undo the selection.

1 Rakha accesses the Wikipedia in Tamil from the public PC at the hotel that has a French keyboard layout.

Just when Rakha realizes he has a problem with the French keyboard, a keyboard icon appears.

When the search box receives the input focus, a keyboard icon is shown to the user as an invitation to interact.

2 Rakha finds guidance on how to introduce a few Tamil characters for the search.

Although Rakha is not familiar with the "transliteration" term, the "show keyboard" label helps him to use the feature.

3 Rakha is able to perform the search and he can access the English version to access more information.

He can access the English version of the article for more information.

Direct access is provided to enable and disable input methods.

4 A musician from Greece asks Rakha if he can print the information on the article in Greek.

Once Rakha types "greek" only one option remains in the list, so he access this link.

5 A musician from Greece asks Rakha if he can print the information on the article in Greek.

He identifies "English" from the list and selects the link.

Changes are immediately previewed in the selected language-related options despite all texts being in Greek.

Bauhaus

■ **Staatliches Bauhaus** ([help/info](#)), commonly known simply as **Bauhaus**, was a school in Germany that combined crafts and the fine arts, and was famous for the approach to design that it publicized and taught. It operated from 1919 to 1933. At that time the German term **Bauhaus**, literally "house of construction" ([help/info](#)) stood for "School of Building".

The Bauhaus school was founded by [Walter Gropius](#) in Weimar. In spite of its name, and the fact that its founder was an architect, the Bauhaus did not have an architecture department during the first years of its existence. Nonetheless it was founded with the idea of creating a "total" work of art in which all arts, including architecture would eventually be brought together. The Bauhaus style became one of the most influential currents in [Modernist architecture](#) and modern design.^[1] The Bauhaus had a profound influence upon subsequent developments in art, architecture, graphic design, interior design, [industrial design](#), and typography.

The school existed in three German cities ([Weimar](#) from 1919 to 1925, [Dessau](#) from 1925 to 1932 and [Berlin](#) from 1932 to 1933), under three different architect-directors: [Walter Gropius](#) from 1919 to 1928, [Hannes Meyer](#) from 1928 to 1930 and [Ludwig Mies van der Rohe](#) from 1930 until 1933, when the school was closed by its own leadership under pressure from the Nazi regime.

The changes of venue and leadership resulted in a constant shifting of focus, technique, instructors, and politics. For instance the pottery shop was discontinued when the school moved from Weimar to Dessau, even though it had been an important revenue source; when [Mies van der Rohe](#) took over the school in 1930, he transformed it into a private school, and allowed only supporters of Hannes Meyer to attend it.





2 Lev combines quick language changes with long periods writing in one language.




Lev can easily change between input languages to use his preferred input method or access the language settings for specific options.
