CONGRESS.

In the Senate Jan. 4, a memoria from the Chamber of Commerce of Charleston, S. C. against increased duties and a counter memorial from Delaware. were presented and referred. A bill to compensate Francis Larche, of New-Orleans, for the loss of a slave, killed while impressed into the service of the United States during the last war, and employed in the transportation of bagage, which bill has before passed the Senate, but been rejected in the House, was considered. The blank was filled with 800 dollars, and the hill ordered to a third reading. A resolution passed instructing the Committee on Commerce, to enquire into the expediency of a further appropriation for building a Light House on or near a ledge of rocks called the "Whale's Back," in the harbor of Portsmouth, N. 88

The consideration of the bill for abolishing Imprisonment for Debt was rearmed. Mr. Hayne proposed an amendment to the bill, which was ultimately withdrawn; and the bill was

Mr. Whitelesey said the committee had made no such allegation. He denied that the United States Government could impress a slave; or that a slave could be employed in the United States service. Even their masters could not take them into that service. And he hoped if gentlemen suffered the whites to remain at home, and took their slaves to battle, if they were lost they would not come to the Treasury for relief. The gentleman from Louisiana had overlooked the fact, that there is no law by which the government can take a slave into its service. The property of the master is, therefore, secure. The slave is protected, in much as the apprentice or minor. He had hoped the report would not have been so misunderstood. Those who live in non-slaveholding States, have the kindest feelings sowards their brethren who hold slaves, and are not disposed to relieve them from them sooner than they desire so be relieved. He hoped the amendment would not prevail.

Mr. Livingston inquired why, if the slave was property, should he not be paid for when taken by the United States and lost in their service? It is the usual practice to pay for property so taken and lost, and why is there to be a distinction between this and other property?
