GRÈVE AT AUGUST

and 3 gryph kettle; there is another due, to
which is attached three large kettles.

4th. A Brick building, for the use of a Smoke
House.

5th. A Brick Building, used as a fowl and pi-
geon house.

6th. A Corn Store, so constructed as to be
clear of rats; measuring 22 feet square; the
front on Melipomene street is built of brick.

7th. A building used as a carriage house and
stable, measuring 74 feet long, by 22 wide.

The building has a brick front on Terpacore

st.; 150 bales of hay may be stowed in its garret.

8th and 9th. Four good walls, walled with
which water is as good as that of the river.

This property is surrounded with orange trees,
which are in production. The interior is plan-
ted with sweet orange, peach, figs and plums
and pomegranates. In front of the principal
house, is a beautiful flower garden, with an ar-
bour of vine in production. The yard in which
the buildings are, is paved with bricks. This
property produces from \$1500 to \$2000, and
may be made to produce more. A Soap Fac-
