THE ACTION HEAR SAN CRISTORAL.—A correspondent in the Evening Picayone gives a somewhat circumstantial and quite interesting

THE ACTION MEAR SAN CRISTORAL.—A correspondent in the Eussing Picopuse gives a somewhat circumstantial and quite interesting account of the engagement in which General Enna was killed. He says:

After the action at Las Pozas, which occurred on the 13th, the patriots continued in position unmolested by the Royslists for nearly two days, when they took up their line of march for the hills. Gen. Enns, at the head of part of his forces, (teaving 400 men at Bahia Honda to guard the arrillery, stores, sick and wounded), crossed the mountains by a different route than that taken by the Battots, and placed himself with Rosales on the south side of the hills. The partola made their appearance in small parties at different points, which kept the irrosps in continual movement. The roads in the plain are filled with water from rocent rains and the reports continually speak of the labor of the solders in marching through continued sloughs. The appearance of a party of Patriots near Callajaboe, a small town two or three leagues from Gusnajay, drew the troops to the east. The next day they were announced as being far west of the army. The troops again took up the line of march west, through the worst possible roads, and on Sunday morning, the 17th, Gen. Enna was advised that Lopez was at a small collee suste at the foot of the hills, one league from San Cristobal, (which town you will find on the road through the wontern plain nearly south of Bahia Honda). The state belonged to the family of Lopez's wife, and toper taken in former years lived there. Gen. Enna inmediately put all his troops in motion, about 1,000 men, and on the near the estate divided them into two columns, one of which he placed under the command of Roseles and ordered to attack the flank of the enemy; the other he led in person. 
