CITY AND STATE NEWS IN BRIEF

A comparison of facts concerning all Louisiana public schools, white and negro, for the years 1900, 1909 and 1917, respectively, shows: Number of schools operating 2390, 2350. There is no law against going over 225; average length of session, six months, seven and a half months, and taking a drink, but there is a law against bringing over one quart of "swell goods" into Mississippi. In the round-up made by the sheriff and his deputies between twenty-five and thirty were caught in the net, a majority of whom were negroes, but several prominent white men from Picayune were in the bunch.

Following a quarrel in the home of Louise Benjamine, 25 years, 1229 Bienville street, late Sunday afternoon, Eleonore Gabriel, 24 years old, 307 North Villere street, was shot three times, it is alleged, by the Benjamin woman. She was taken to the charity Hospital where her condition is said to be critical.

About noon Sunday David Finkelstein, aged 40 years, residing at 1216 St. Ann street, attempted to commit suicide by jumping in the Old Basin at the head of Basin street. He was rescued by George Mathin, 1604 Ursuline street. Finkelstein had formerly been an attaché of Section B of the Criminal District Court. The cause of his act is given as insanity.

The police were active all over the city Sunday and made a number of arrests on the charge of violation of the Sun-day closing law.

The Klotz Cracker Factory, 615-21 Tchoupitoulas street, burned Sunday night, the building, plant and heavy stock carried is a total loss, estimated by the police on the authority of the owners to be worth

\$10,000. H. P. Gottman owns the building, valued at \$70,000. A. J. Thomas, manager and president, has been exporting quantities of crackers and cakes recently. He said his company has had government contracts. The factory has been working day and night shirts to 500 big orders and was carrying an unusually heavy stock. It employed about 100 men and women. These will be thrown out of work for months.

Nearly four hundred Washington Artillerymen and officers, who came to New Orleans Friday in special trains from Alexandria, La., where the artillery is encamped, left New Orleans for Alexandria Sunday evening. The men, who arrived in New Orleans late Friday afternoon, came as a special guard to the Washington Artillery's football team, which played Tulane University at the Tulane campus Saturday afternoon.

A thorough, systematic and far-reaching campaign is under way in the Gulf Division of the American Red Cross, as in other sections of the country, to obtain full and final reports on the results of the great war drive for funds in response to the appeal of President Wilson last June. The results of that appeal were particularly gratifying in New Orleans, which went well over the top in the amount contributed in cash and pledges.




