rate resolution of managing the prisoners, who endeavoured to rejoin their comrades, and his cavalry charged the enemy with such fury that they gave way, and so the Pacha returned to Edessa without further obstacle.

The Sultan is still in the camp at Ismilia Tebille, but it is thought he will soon set out for Adrianople.

FRANCE.

The King of France has conferred the Order of the Legion of Honour on Lieutenant Codrington, son of Sir E. Codrington, from Liverpool, for his distinguished bravery at Navarino. On the same day, the Order was also conferred on Caesar Moreau, Esq. F.R.S. for his able and laborious statistical tables, which he compiled in this country.

Acquorts have been received from Paris, of the massacre of the whole Greek population of the island of Candia by the Turks. It is said that a conspiracy among the Greeks against the ruling Pacha, was either discovered or pretended to be so, on which occasion the butchery took place.

It appears by the letters from Bourdeaux that most of the wealthy Spaniards, who were expelled from Mexico, by a decree of the Chambers, have fixed their residence in that city, and by the aid of their capital and industry, have given a decided impulse to its trade. There is a knot of from twelve to fifteen of them whose united wealth may be estimated to be between two and three millions sterling, who regularly meet together to discuss those commercial operations which appear to offer great advantages.

The Journal de Rosen says, that the purchasers of spun cotton are at present very limited, but that raw cotton has risen from 9 to 12 per cent. within the week. This is owing to the smallness of the quantity now in Havre; but it is thought that the inactivity of the calico manufactory will soon lower the price of the raw material. Several regiments of the Guerrillas are getting numerous, and daring in proportion. In the province of Beira, another Guerrilla corps has been formed, by a rich and respectable landowner of Castillo Branco, like that of Misho, its station is the town of Sarreal. In Alentejo, the old Guerrillas of the celebrated Coca, have increased a good deal latterly, and are expected to be in a short time superior in number to the others, as their vicinity to this capital, will, no doubt, induce an immense number of volunteers to join them. After all this, nothing more or less than another civil war may be expected soon to take place.

The French Papers obtain no news from the East of a character entitled to any particular attention, either for novelty or importance. The accoups from Constantinople are only since the 10th Oct., and they consequently refer to events which took place several days previous to the fall of Varna. The reported surrender of Silistria has not yet confirmed by any intelligence from the usual channels of communication with the seat of war; but each an event is by no means improbable in the present juncture of Russian affairs in that quarter. The advanced state of the season urges the necessity of increased enterprise on both the belligerents; and though the fact of possession is strongly in favor of the Turks, yet the security obtained by the Russians, in consequence of the fall of Varna, will serve materially to confirm their confidence, and stimulate to much daring.

Zea Bermudez, Ex-Minister for Foreign Affairs to the King of Spain, has arrived at Paris on his way to England, as Minister Plenipotentiary to our Court.

The Courrier de Smyrne of the 14th of October says that the corps brought by the Grand Vizier for the deliverance of Varna, consisted of twelve thousand men, and Hussein Pacha had sent eight thousand from Scutula. It was believed at that time that if Varna could hold out for another month, the Russians would be obliged to re-pass the Danube. The Sultan had ordered that all persons who visited the camp at Ramis Tschiflik should be in military costume. The Ulemas had represented to him how necessary his presence was in the centre of the empire; nevertheless, he appeared resolved to put himself at the head of his troops, if fortune should be unfavourable to the Turkish arms. Several Tartars have been news from Asia that General Paeschewitz was advancing towards Erzeroum but that he had been attacked by the population of the towns and villages of the environs. It was also said that Pera, encouraged by the obstinate resistance of the Turks, was going to take up arms again. Letters from Odessa of the 19th October announce that the Russian army pursues its advantages beyond Varna. According to these letters, Resurgas had fallen into the power of the troops of his Imperial Majesty on the 14th. News was every moment expected that Silistria was taken.

LONDON, November 8. The Sultan's camp at Ramis Tschiflik defends the capital on the north-west; the Seraskier, at Daud Pacha, protects it on the south. While the strength and discipline of the armies are thus extended to the greatest activity prevalent in the dock-yards, and by the reception of the Egyptian fleet, which is expected to Constantinople, it is thought that the Turks may again have a strong force in the Black Sea.
