Cultivation of the thornless cactus for the purpose of developing a new industry in Louisiana has been started by Mrs. J. E. LeBlanc, widow of the late Senator Joseph E. LeBlanc, at her home near Paincourtville, Assumption parish. Mrs. LeBlanc obtained a large supply of cactus plants from the West and they are now growing on her farm. The cactus makes an excellent food for live stock, including horses, mules, cattle and hogs, and is especially valuable for milch cows.

Robert Williams, negro ash hauler was scalded to death in the basement of the Edison Electric Light plant, Dryades and Union streets, by a burst of steam from a broken pipe Friday night. Williams lived in Union street, back of the plant. He is from Honduras.
