REMARKS.—That a day should pass at this season of the year without a single sale of cotton, tobacco, or sugar is now a fact. The market is now in a state of stagnation. The prices had fallen 6 per cent.

CITY COUNCIL.

Session of Tuesday, April 13, 1836.

A letter from the mayor was received. The first part was only read, and it suggested to the council the propriety of making the necessary appointment.

Mr. Pichot moved that the municipality should be taken by municipality and each district of said municipalities by district; agreed to.

Mr. Schmidt rose to explain the law directing the appointment.

Mr. Allard thinks that no discussion is necessary on this subject.

Mr. Pichot observed that he disagreed with the gentleman from the 8th ward—this subject is one of the first importance; & if there are any doubts, discussion is best suited to settle them. [Here the gentleman recited the 6th article of the law creating the districts, & did not pretend that this law is perfect; but a well-known man of the 8th ward—] Still it is particularly anxious that our citizens try all candidates by these tests.

We do not intend ourselves to propose or oppose any, as we are supposed to be unacquainted with the personal merits or demerits of any candidate, & have no known least desire to interfere in local elections, which we are desirous should be conducted in any manner by party tactics.

Mr. Schmidt moved that it be declared that as there are to be 668 voters in the first ward of the first representative, that ward be represented by seven aldermen; agreed.

The number of aldermen appointed for the different wards of the different municipalities is stated in the following table and received the assent of the council:
