This fact was not desired by two mans charged with the superintendence of the female prisoners, and whose declarations were

who is employed in this establishment to superintend the slaves of the Police Jail. This fact was not denied by the woman charged with the superintendence of the semale prisoners, and whose declarations were corroborated by the exemination the Grand Jury has made of the bruises on the bodies of several female prisoners, occasioned by the laxbos infisited on them. Our laws have abolished the degrading punishment of whipping for offseces of a higher nature; how much less ought it to be permitted that white females, detained in that prison, should be dealt with in that manner. The Grand Jury totally disapperere of this mode of punishment, so matter by whom it is in flicted, and considers solitary confinement as likely to produce the wanted effect.

The rooms or cells occupied by the white prisoners were well acrubbed and found in good order; but the Hospital is not kept so clean as it ought to be.

The rooms in the Police Jail for blacks were found in a very divty condition, and evident signs of long previous neglect were apparent to the Grand Jurors.

The Hospital for white females in the boliding for made and female blacks, in the opinion of the Grand Jury ought to be removed.
