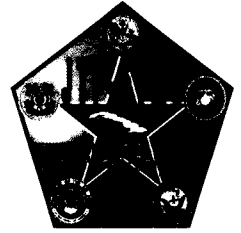

2. (FOUO) Health: Detainee is in good health. He is allergic to penicillin. Detainee has latent tuberculosis and has completed treatment. He has no travel restrictions.

3. (S//NF) JTF GTMO Assessment:

a. (S) Recommendation: JTF GTMO recommends detainee be Released or Transferred to the Control of Another Country (TR).

b. (S) Summary: The detainee does not appear to a member of the Taliban and/or Al-Qaida and it's global terrorism network. Based on a review of previous interrogations conducted on this detainee, the circumstances surrounding his capture, statements given, his behavior and level of cooperation, the detainee has had no level of combatant or terrorist training. Detainee does not appear to have participated or directly supported terrorist acts or been a key member of a terrorist network.

4. (S//NF) Detainee Background Summary: Unless otherwise noted, the following paragraphs are based solely on the detainee's statements.

a. (S) Prior History: Detainee is a Sunni Muslim, a descendent of the Firyzay clan, of the Al Azai tribe. He was born, raised, and lived his whole life in Afghanistan. Detainee does not know his date of birth, only that he is approximately 60 years old. He cannot read or write, has no military training, and is not a member of the Taliban. Detainee has no other affiliations, political or otherwise, and is not a member of any organizations or clubs. For the last three years he has resided in the village of Worzai, AF, located in the Darah District, which is in the Helmand Province. Prior to living in Worzai detainee resided in upper Angorchagh. Detainee has never left Afghanistan. Detainee has one wife, Zalahahn, age unknown; two sons, Woli, age 16, and Sathmoolook, age 15; and one daughter, Gulbashrah, age three months old. Detainee spent most of his life working as a farmer and traveling with gypsies, working menial labor jobs to provide for his family. Detainee's most recent job was clearing farmland for Abdul Razik, a landowner in Worzai. Detainee spent his spare time gathering wood in Warzimont near his village. Detainee would then trade the wood for wheat and corn, which he used to feed his family. Detainee does not own land of his own.

b. (S) Recruitment and Travel: Detainee hasn't traveled outside of Afghanistan in his entire life.

c. (S) Training and Activities: Detainee does not have military or extremist training.

d. (S) Capture Information: Detainee had traveled from his home village to his older brother's village of Warzia, AF to celebrate the EID holiday with his family. (Analyst note: EID is comparable to Thanksgiving or Christmas in the U.S., families travel to be with each other, feast and dress up in their best clothes.) Detainee heard a commotion, looked outside and saw Americans coming. Detainee saw others running, but did not run himself. The US forces waved the detainee towards them and he went to them. They asked the name of his village, and when he told them he was arrested.

e. (S) Transferred to JTF GTMO: 9 May 2003

f. (S//NF) Reasons for Transfer to JTF GTMO: Detainee's file does not indicate why he was sent to JTF GTMO.

5. (S//NF) Detainee Threat:

a. Assessment: It has been determined that the detainee poses a LOW risk, as he is not likely to pose a threat to the US, its interests and allies.

b. Reasons for Release or Transfer:

- Detainee was apprehended after a name similar to his was heard on a radio intercept thought to be originating from a group of individuals acting as sentries, reporting US troop movements to the Taliban. It has been assessed that detainee is not the same individual mentioned in the intercept. He is not associated with the Taliban and/or Al-Qaida.
 - Detainee was captured because he had the same name as one heard on an intercepted radio communication regarding US troop movement.
 - Detainee shares the same last name of a former Taliban leader.
 - According to further reporting and analysis, the name that was intercepted was "Mullah Nasim." It was assumed by the capturing troops that "Mullah Nasim" and detainee were one and the same. While the name mentioned in the radio transmission is similar to the detainee's, it is not the same. (Analyst note: After careful review of detainee's files and national-level databases, there has been no documentation discovered indicating that this individual is now or ever been addressed by anyone as "Mullah" or "Mullah Nasim.")

c. Detainee's Conduct: Detainee has had some incidents of passive aggressive behavior while here in detention. Detainee has no forced cell extractions or self-harm incidents.

6. (S//NF) Detainee Intelligence Value Assessment:

a. Assessment: JTF GTMO has determined that this detainee is of LOW intelligence value.


- Detainee is assessed to hold little or no intelligence value.

Health Assessment: ISN 958 has a history of dyspepsia. Otherwise, he is in good health.

Background and Capture Data: Detainee claims he was born in Warzi village, Darah District, Helmand province, AF, and has worked on a farm his entire life. When taken into custody by US forces in Afghanistan, detainee claims that US personnel told him that they had received reports of a Mullah Nasim placed into custody. Mullah Nasim was a notorious Taliban military commander. Detainee claims to have no military training and is not a member of the Taliban. Nasim has no other affiliations, political or otherwise, and is not a member of any organizations. The name Mullah Nasim was referenced in intercepted radio transmissions and he was assessed as being a part of a group of individuals who acted as sentries to report troop movement to the Taliban. US Forces moved into the location that Mullah Nasim and Mohammed Nasim were one in the same. It is assessed that the detainee is a poor farmer and his arrest was due to mistaken identity.

Date of Capture: 11 February 2003

Risk Level: Low Based on a review of previous interrogations, circumstances surrounding

Risk Assessment: his capture, statements given, his behavior and the level of cooperation, it is assessed that the detainee has had no level of combatant or terrorist training. Detainee does not appear to have participated or directly supported terrorist acts, or been a key member of a terrorist network.

Intelligence Value: Low

Exploitation Requirements: None

Recommendation: Cannot concur with Transfer to the Control of Another Country for Continued Detention. Recommend Release or Transfer to the Control of Another Country for Continued Detention
