Loss of the revenue.

FULL PARTICULARS—STATEMENT OF CANTON, SOA, SAO.

The steamer Canton, of New Orleans, on the night of the 11th, about 8 o'clock, with a light wind in favor, for the purpose of lightening her load, over the Ship Place, in Red River, proceeded up the river with 100 soldiers on board, and about 100 negroes. About the middle of the 12th, when first transferred about one-half of the freight to the lighter, the cabin over the falls, which had been left, was very nearly gone, and, arrived at sunset, which being completed, loaded the cabin over the falls and began to make preparations to cross, when being compelled, had to leave the ship, which when I alighted the mate said, "I am not bound without your approval."

The other mate, Lewis, was laying just above the falls at the time. He captain had the lives of the crew, boat, and other articles which had escaped, sent across to him, when he said, "I am not bound without your approval."
