THE Regents of the Central and Primary schools having procured healthy, commodious, and central location for the upper primary school have the pleasure of announcing to the public, that it is, this day, re-opened under the care of Doctor J. A. Kaurer, principal, and J. Duval assistant, in the Baptist Church, Lafayette square.

The lower primary school under the care of Mr. Bigot, principal, and Kaurer assistant, and the Central school under the care of Messrs. Murray, principal, Eschot and Roca de Santi Prieto, professors, continue, as heretofore, in the old Convent of Ursulines, Couité Street. Books and Stationery furnished by the pupils or charged separately. In each of the schools one hundred pupils unable to pay for their education are admitted and taught gratis.
