Nueva Orleans 9 de junio 1830. Por el correo de ayer recibimos les disrice de New York hasta el 20 del parado aun no contienon noticias de Europa. El Mizrio del Comercio de esa ciudad ha redac tado como lo Itabia prometido en su nume ra del 18 algunos detalles sobre fas desavenencias habidas acerca de las negociaciones entre la Francia y Haity. El Editor dice que se habia rquivocado indicando al buron Pichon como Consul Frances: "Es un agente particular embiado por el gobierno frances en el mismo buque en que volvió á embarcarse, para arregiar les asuntes pen dientes entre los dos naciones; pero parece que esto no pudo efectuarse de ningun modo. El hijo del mencionado Pichon que estava agregado al consulado se vuelve á Francia con su padre. Queda el cónsul en Puerto-Principe...

Keta última circunstancia basta para probar que puede no haberse perdido toda esperanza de reconciliacion. A continuacion damos algunos estractos :


