Buenos Ayres.—We have received a letter from Buenos Ayres, under date of 4th October, which says:—The public funds have fallen to 48 & 50, in consequence of the government having created a new fund of three millions dollars, which was taken up at 88 dollars per 100.

From our file of Buenos Ayres papers to the 16th October, we glean the following items:—The provinces of Cordova and Buenos-Ayres have entered into a treaty for carrying on the war against Brazil.

Our accounts from Montevideo are to the 1st instant. We learn that on the 29th of Sept. Admiral Brown presented himself in that port, in the schooner, under American colours and anchored near the United States corvette Boston, which he visited under pretence of asking advice.
