"The nomination of Charles E. Hughes and Charles W. Fairbanks, respectively as President and Vice-President, is the first time when both candidates of a party have had the same first name, since 1864, when George B. McClellan, of New Jersey, and George H. Pendleton, of Ohio, were the Democratic candidates, and as that ticket was defeated, so will be the Republican ticket this year."

"Fairbanks, is the second ex-Vice-President nominated for that office; the other was A. E. Stevenson, who was elected with Cleveland, in 1892, and was nominated with and defeated with Bryan in 1900, and so will Fairbanks be defeated this year."

"There has been for some years gossip to the effect that Justice Hughes of the Supreme Court, might be picked as the Republican candidate for President."

"Justice Hughes shows himself to be the right kind of a man and the right kind of a judge when he, at the expense of his own personal ambitions, refuses to enter into any political scramble for office."—(An extract from the Pathfinder, May 15, 1915.)

"If President Wilson and Vice-President Marshall are re-elected, it will be the first time that a president and vice-president have been re-elected since 1820, when James Monroe, of Virginia, and Daniel D. Tompkins, of New York, were re-elected."

"As the Democrats elected the House in 1914, if precedents count for anything, Wilson ought certainly to be elected this year."
