It being necessary that the communication of the Supreme Government of Mexico concerning the claims, which has been communicated to the Minister of the Mexican United States in New York, should be known to all the citizens of this State, we literally publish it as follows:

The undersigned, Minister Plenipotentiary of the U. States of Mexico, has to announce to the citizens of the United States of America who have any claims on the Mexican Government, that since H. E. the Vice-President of this republic began his executive functions, he has ever considered as sacred all the contracts of the Nation and has employed more active measures to procure to the government the means in satisfying all contracted obligations...
