SUBJECT: Administrative Review Board Input for Guantanamo Detainee, ISN: US9BA-000060DP (U)

1. (S//NF) JTF GTMO recommends to the Administrative Review Board (ARB) that this detainee be transferred to the control of another country for continued detention (TRCD).

2. (S//NF) Summary of Most Recent JTF GTMO Assessment, signed on 11 November 2003.

- a. (S//NF) Most Recent JTF GTMO Recommendation: Retain under DoD Control.
- b. (S//NF) Threat Level in Most Recent JTF GTMO Assessment: High.
- c. (S//NF) Intelligence Value in Most Recent JTF GTMO Assessment: Medium.

d. (FOUO) Note: JTF GTMO's system of identifying detainees as High, Medium or Low threat has evolved over time. The threat and intelligence values listed above may have been adjusted to conform with the most recent standards.

3. (S//NF) Update Since Most Recent Assessment.

a. (S//NF) Summary. It is assessed that this detainee is a member of Al-Qaida and/or its global terrorist network. He has been neither forthright nor cooperative during his interrogations. In addition, there are inconsistencies in the detainee's story. Detainee's travel patterns and contacts indicate the detainee did not travel to Afghanistan to help the poor as he claimed, but that he in fact traveled to Afghanistan to fight Jihad against the United States and was probably supported and facilitated by Al-Qaida. The detainee was captured with a confirmed Al-Qaida member, but refuses to explain in detail the true circumstances of this


association. Detainee is assessed to be a probable Al-Qaida recruit and he has clearly demonstrated his dedication to Jihad. Detainee has also been disruptive and aggressive while in detention and has had to be confined in the maximum-security unit because of his behavior.

b. (S//NF) Updated Threat Level. JTF GTMO has determined that detainee is a medium threat to the US and its allies. Although detainee has consistently denied that he went to Afghanistan for jihadist reasons, his brother, Mahir Kamil Abdullah Haji, provides evidence that detainee actually went to Afghanistan twice for jihadist purposes. There is no indication that detainee received advanced training or had any leadership role in Al-Qaida.

(1) (S) Mahir claimed that his brother (detainee) went to Afghanistan for two months for jihad against the Soviets in 1988.

(2) Mahir also alleged that the detainee left to fight in Afghanistan in October 2001. At this time Mahir had also decided to go to Afghanistan for jihad himself. Mahir stated that he and his brother (detainee) agreed that the detainee would go to Afghanistan first and then call Mahir to tell of his whereabouts in Afghanistan. Detainee coordinated for Mahir to be brought into Afghanistan from Iran via a Baluchi smuggler from Mashad, Iran for \$350USD.

(4) (S//NF) Updated Intelligence Value. JTF GTMO has determined that the detainee is of low intelligence value. He is assessed as being fully exploited.
