Universal Military Training League.

(Continued from Yesterday.)

Dr. Harry Pratt Judson, president of the University of Chicago, says: "There is an absolute need of universal military training. Formerly I believed that we had reached a stage in civilization where international disputes could be settled in accordance with the principles of right and justice; and the smaller nations would have respectful treatment from mighty powers, but my ideas have undergone a change. There are great powers which classify as national pirates. It is their deliberate policy to take possession of other nations. In the face of such policies, it is apparent that the United States is in danger of attack. We are a rich and help- less people and invite attack from a piratical power."

The venerable Bishop Samuel Fal- lows, eminent as a preacher and ex- orator, says: "I can see no safety for our country in the future unless we prepare to meet any emergency. We must be in a position to defend our flag, protect our citizens and guard our borders from invasion."

DO YOU KNOW: That every Ameri- can boy, when he reaches the age of eighteen, under existing laws, becomes automatically subject to military duty? He remains subject to call until he reaches the age of forty-five years. Training does not increase, or in any way change the existing liability. The Chamberlain bill provides for a sane and sensible plan of military training, for all young men, physically fit. It is a splendid measure, carefully thought out, and should become a law without delay.
