We have received Paris papers up to the 12th of March; they are altogether filled with the Debates which have taken place in the House of Deputies.

Latest from Buenos Ayres.—The last advice from this country indicate a very unsettled state of things. On the 13th inst. the schooner Leo, Capt Raines, bringing an account of the defeat of the principal body of those who had taken up arms to resist the usurpation of Lavalle, and of the execution of another of the Chiefs opposed to the present Government.

Mr. Henry Gilbert, editor of the Gazette Mercantile, is not, it seems, likely to leave his life for the offensive orotic on Lavalla.

BUENOS AYRES, Feb. 14. The prisoners taken in the last action at Palmira arrived in town under an escort of the Carabiers on Thursday last, including the Chief Mesa, and so-called Minister of war Cespedes.

BUENOS AYRES, Feb. 16. "I have this day witnessed the death of Mesa, who was shot in the public Plaza, he was one of the chiefs opposed to the present Government, and taken in arms against it.
