Captain Carpender and his clerk, Mr. Wilkinson, urser Cutter, and a number of seamen, late of the orig Truston, are on board the John Adams. The reainder of the Truston prisoners are on board the tate ship Relief, bound to Penencola, to sail soon with the exception of some twelve who were left at Tuxpan, sick.
