When any one is committed for trial before the First District Court, all the papers shall be sent to easic Court within twenty-four hours after such commitment. The Recorders shall be suitted to one or more clerks, to be appointed conjointly by the Board of Aldermen, and their salaries to be fixed by the Common Council. The Recorders shall alone have power to release on ball persons arrested by virtue of a warrant issued by these, and confised in the look-ups The salaries of the Recorders shall be \$3,500

The salaries of the Becorders shall be \$3,500 per ansum. In case of absence, sickness, etc., the Recorders pro tem. shall perform their duties, and while so acting, shall receive the mane ratio of salary as the Recorders. The Becorders shall have concurrent jurisdiction with the First District Court for the trial of offense and makemeancers, and shall have the same powers, for such purposes, as are now enjoyed bythe First District Gourt; such as the issuing of orders and write, and the punishing for contempt. The Recorders' clerks are empowered to issue subpoense, suswecesse and notices of trial. 'Good and bona fide ball shall slone be taken.
