**IMPORTANT STATE PAPERS.**

A very important document and one which

We adduce to a dispatch made

by the Secretary of State, Gen. C. M.

to the Secretary of War, Gen. J. G.

"Prosecutor, to seek action as may be

necessary, a naval force will be sent to

the coast of Mexico, with orders to afford

all necessary protection to our citizens

and their property, and the commanding

officers will be directed to com-

mand them, upon all the subjects

which may relate to the protection of

our citizens and their property."

Let the administration practice what it

promises, and we shall yet have a foreign

war with Mexico.

The French army at home is to be aug-

mented, and the government of Nica-

monishing us to make its demand
