SUBJECT: (S//NF) Transfer Recommendation for Guantanamo Detainee, Mollah Shed Abdul Rehman, ISN: US9AF-000581DP

1. (S) **Personal Information:** Mollah Shed Abdul Rehman is a Pakistani national born in 1965 (age 38) in Sheen, Pakistan. He has been diagnosed with latent Tuberculosis and Chronic Acute Hepatitis B, but is otherwise in good health.
2. (S//NF) **Detention Information:** Subject detainee has the Afghanistan identifier in his ISN. A request has been sent to NDRC to have the ISN Country Identifier changed to Pakistan. Detainee was arrested by Pakistani authorities while in his home in the fall of 2001. He was arrested and charged with the theft of antiquities even though detainee states they had no proof. Detainee was sent to jail in Quetta, Pakistan for 36 days. According to the detainee, he was then "sold" to the U.S. authorities in Kandahar, Afghanistan. Detainee was subsequently transported to Guantanamo Bay Naval Base, Cuba on 17 June 2002 because of his knowledge of the Sorkhab refugee camp, and information on fighting with the Mujahideen forces against the Russians. Detainee has referenced in all his mail home that he wanted his family to keep up the chicken farm and to enquire about his "amanata" which is translated as something precious or valuable that is given to someone else for safekeeping. A name very similar to the detainee's (Abdul Rehman) was found in sensitive reporting identifying Taliban plans to send 39 individuals to Russia and countries of the Former Soviet Union to carry out unspecified terrorist acts. There was a passport number associated with the document, however the U.S. does not have a copy of detainee's passport to match the passport numbers.
3. (S) **Assessment:** Based on information collected and available to Joint Task Force Guantanamo as of 21 August 2003, detainee ISN: US9AF-000581DP is assessed as being neither affiliated with Al-Qaida nor a Taliban leader. Moreover, based on the detainee's folder, the knowledgeability brief, and subsequent interrogations by JTF Guantanamo, the



detainee is of low intelligence value to the United States. Based on the above, detainee poses a low threat to the U.S., its interests or its allies.

4. (S) **Recommendation:** In view of the foregoing, I recommend subject detainee be considered for release or transfer to the control of another government for continued detention.

5. (C) **Coordination:** JTF Guantanamo notified the Criminal Investigative Task Force of this recommendation on 18 August 2003.

Health Assessment: ISN 581 is in good health.

Background and Capture Data: See TR Memo dated: 30 August 2003: Rescind memo in progress.

Date of Capture: 25 November 2001

Risk Level: High Detainee was recently identified from his photo as the former Taliban

Risk Assessment: judge in Kabul, AF. The detainee was identified as Abdul Rahman Agha, from the Pinshin District, Quetta, PK. Reporting indicates that the detainee was directly responsible for the execution of persons he sentenced to death under the Taliban rule. Detainee is also suspected of being a member of the ISID. Detainee has not been forthcoming during his detention. Additionally, detainee has referenced in all his mail home that he wanted his family to keep up the chicken farm and to enquire about given to someone else for safekeeping. Furthermore, a name very similar ive reporting identifying Taliban plans to send 39 individuals to Russia and countries of the Former Soviet Union to carry out unspecified terrorist acts. There was a passport number associated with the document, however the U.S. does not have a copy of d Based on information collected and available to Joint Task Force

Intelligence Value: High

Exploitation Requirements: Information on Taliban leadership and terrorist operations, ISID involvement and support of subversive activities in support or terrorism and, possible connections to Al-Qaida and global terrorist networks.

Recommendation: Cannot concur with Release or Transfer to the Control of Another Country for Continued Detention. Update to Retain in DoD control.

Guantanamo ISN: US9AF-000581DP is assessed as being a Taliban leader.
