THE DISTRICT EMANCIPATION BILL. The DISTRICT LEARCHATHOR SILL.

The House today passed the Senate bill amendatory of the act emancipating the slaves in the District. One section extends the time for making claims and producing evidence in the case of masters who are officers in the army and navy, infants, wives, and idits, in conformity to the suggestion of the President in his message accompanying his signature to the act.

Another section enables the freed man to pro-Another section enables the freed man to pro-curs a certificate of freedom in cases where the master has refused or neglected to procure it for bim; and still another section authorizes negro testimony to be introduced on the same footing with white testimony before the Equancipation Commissioners. The bill only lacks the signa-ture of the President to become a law.
