Vivex President; Arango, Coun sellor of the Indies; Pinillar, actual Intendent of Havana; Lallave and Gen:ro, ex deputies to the Cortes in Spain and that twenty millions of dollars had been advanced by opulent persons in Havana to defray the expenses of the expedition.

Treaty with Hally .- It is now cer tain, says the Journal do Havre of June 1st, that the Treaty between France and Havii is signed; but it is difficult for us to believe that this ar rangement is founded, as is generally reported, on the basis of perfect recipro city. Whatever improvidence may be attributed to our Missiers in their diplomatic transactions, we must not pe of far as to accuse them of an act which

implies the complete absence of reason Hayti possesses no marine; we have a large one. Our vessels, then, on the principles of reciprocity, will go and pay duties at Hayti, while in our ports we receive nothing in return! There can not be the least possible reciprocity bet ween us and Hayti, in respect to navigation.
