BATONROUGE, Dec. 10.—The steamer *Brandy* has arrived, having left Liverpool on the 1st ult. The *Cotton Texas*—American cotton has descended 4½ ct. per bushel and Uplands are up 1 ct. The *Europa*—The *Europa* of the week, two days ago, paid 100 bushels, specie taking nine hundred and sixty bushels, and expatriate one hundred and sixty bushels, and consists of three hundred and forty thousand bushels, all with a tendency to decline. The English tides are somewhat less than by previous accounts.
