**From the New-Orleans Price Current of Saturday August 13.**  
Cotton.—Arrived since the 5th inst of Louisiana and Mississippi 665 bales. Cleared, in the same time, for Liverpool 854, Marselles 361, Bremen 74, Gottenburg 235, New-York 52, Philadelphia 53, Baltimore 133, together 1892; making a reduction in stock of 1227, and leaving on hand, inclusive of all on ship-board not cleared on the 11th inst., a stock 22,933 bales. There has been very little done since our last report, and notwithstanding the small quantity in market, prices have a downward tendency. A sale of 700 bales, of which 130 were Mississippi, the remainder Alabama and Tennessee cotton, was made at 7 1/2 cents round, and from our observation we would infer that the article had suffered a reduction in opinion, if not in reality, of about 1/2 cent per lb. Our inquiries as to the new crop, afford nothing yet of interest.
