I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your communication in which you proposed to me the following questions, for answer, in my official capacity...

Question 1st: Has or has not the Second Municipality, by her default in paying the accruing interest on the bonds, forfeited her right to be released from the payment of one per cent per annum for the interest required by the act of the Legislature...

Question 2d: If you answer the preceding question in the affirmative, does or does not the claim of the State against said municipality extend to the maturity of the bonds, and if so, to what amount...

Question 3d: Can the State proceed to the collection of her claims against said municipality, and if so, under what conditions...
