SOUTH AMERICA. Latest from Rio Janeiro and Brazil. We learn from the Baltimore papers that the schooner Elliofarrived there on Monday in 38 days from Rio Janeiro. The principal item of news is the conclusion of a Treaty of Commerce with Brazils, by Mr. Fudor, the American Charge d'Affairs The shipping intelligence will be found under its proper head.


