### GEN. PRICE ON THE MOVE.

We have received the Mobile Evening Telegraph of the 3d and 4th, and the Jackson Mississippian of the 4th, 5th and 6th inst. We publish this morning the news contained in the Mississippian of the 6th, and in our next edition we will give the news in the other papers.

VICKSBURG.

All eyes are now turned eagerly toward Vicksburg. Tremendous interest is heard throughout the country in the establishment of the result of its looks for ultimate safety. Our people, however, evince the most perfect confidence in the valor and endurance of our brave garrison. When all the circumstantial evidence of the impregnable nature of Vicksburg are weighed, it will be conceded that the annals of war scarcely furnish a parallel to the stubborn resistance and undying heroism which she has exhibited.

MEMPHIS, June 6.—Sixty-four regiments from Corinth and other points entered Memphis and passed down to reinforce Grant on Tuesday and Wednesday, in refutation of the reports.

About 3000 came out from Memphis towards

the CARGO OF THE GLADIATOR.

The Federal Navy Department has received advice that the steamer Gladiator sailed from Liverpool on the 24 ult., with 500 barrels of bread and 1000 barrels of bacon bound for Corinth. It is reported that the steamer will not be able to reach Corinth before the 1st of July. We can assure them that a great portion, if not the whole of the above shipment, has reached a Confederate port.

### THE FEDERAL ARMY AT MECHANICSBURG.

We are informed by a gentleman direct from Corinth, that the Federal Army, reported to have been 1500 strong, had made a dash on Mechanicsburg, and had captured the town.

On Thursday, Colonel Adams, cavalry were directed to ride out to Mechanicsburg, and it is reported that General Walker was attacked and defeated by the enemy with heavy loss.

LAWYER.

A horseman who arrived some hours later than our first informant gives quite a different version of the engagement. He reports that our troops were victorious, and took 400 prisoners.

### PRICE'S PRICE ON THE WARM PAINT.

We are informed by an officer directly from Corinth, that General Price, commanding the Federal Army at Corinth, had ordered his troops to keep fire-drills prepared, and ready at a moment's warning to move. It is supposed that the veteran General is now close upon Helena, threatening to cut off our communications.

### GENERAL BOSSARD'S PARTIERS.

Our reporter yesterday brought into Jackson a small party of Federal cavalry which was captured near Edwards' Depot. The party had collected twenty head of cattle and many other articles of value, and it is reported that they had volunteered for that service. Two other negroes that were pressed into service were brought to this city, but the place expressing reluctance to admit to Jackson, was hung.

PRESIDENT DAVIS' PLANTATION DESTROYED.

Last Sunday a body of the 7th Kentucky went up the creek to the plantation of President Davis, and made a most destructive and every implement of his bonyard, all his household and kitchen furniture, defeating the premises, and carry away and destroy the only article of value, the place. The plan of Mr. Davis, the master of the plantation, was treated in the same way, if not worse, for his domestic servants left.

### PRISONERS "WORTH THEIR SALT."

At the recent fight in Kentucky, Gen. Morris sent over a dispatch to the commander of the 1st Kentucky, in which he said, "Send me some for coffee, salt, and the like—so many privates to be given for a sack of coffee and sugar." He, however, remarked in the dispatch that he did not suppose they would give much for the prisoners.
