FUNERAL CEREMONIES IN HONOR OF

PRESIDENT HARRISON.

The Native American Association, in a spirit of nationality and patriotism, have determined upon a funeral procession and public oration in veneration of the memory of General Harrison, and as a testimony of profound respect for the exalted office in which he held the debt of nature. The committee for that purpose adopted the 14th day of May, for the day recommended by president Tyler, to be observed by the nation at large as one of prayer and mourning—for those touching and appropriate ceremonies.

As a proof that considerations higher than party

have prompted this display of public grief and respect,

the gentleman selected to deliver the oration is not of the party of those who elected the venerable patriot to the chief magistracy, and as an evidence that these sentiments were not conceived in a narrow and sectional spirit, the citizens generally were invited to attend its meeting at which they were resolved upon.

The oration will be delivered by C. K. Johnson, Esq., a gentleman every way competent to the task.

The Washington Battalion have volunteered to escort the procession through the streets. It is to be hoped that the citizens generally, the companies and various societies will assist. It is the first time since our national existence, that the people have been called upon to do homage to the memory of a president who died in that exalted office, and the occasion should be solemnized in a manner worthy the magnitude and great public services of the deceased, the high station which he held, and the nation to whom he has so signalized his services.
