SUBJECT: Update Recommendation to Release or Transfer to the Control of Another Country (TR) for Guantanamo Detainee, ISN: US9YM-000503DP (S)

1. (FOUO) Personal Information:

- Name: Mohammed Sleh Ali
- Aliases: Saleh Mohamed Al Zuba, Saleh Mohammad Ali Al Zoub
- Place of Birth: Sana'a, Yemen (YM)
- Date of Birth: 01 January 1955
- Citizenship: Yemen (YM)

2. (FOUO) Health:

a. History: 49 year old Yemeni who has known coronary artery disease with symptoms for 8-10 years. Detainee had a catheterization in Yemen, but "not successful", he says. He had stents place in two vessels in March 2003; he had an occluded, non-operable right coronary artery. Since then has had some episodes of chest pain, but no myocardial infarction. Detainee has a history of hypercholesterolemia and hypertension, also with H. pylori and history of epigastric pain; he has refused to finish medical regimen for eradication of H. pylori. Also with history of shrapnel to left shoulder in 2001. History of depression in the early 1990's in Yemen.

b. Treatment: Detainee's medications include Tricor, Atenolol, ECASA, Plavix, Lipitor and Isordil.

c. Function: Detainee reports that he estimates he walks 2 km twice per day. Once every couple of weeks he will have an episode of chest tightness and mild dyspnea while walking that resolves when he rests. These symptoms have not worsened or become more frequent and do not occur at rest.

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d. Prognosis: Detainee's coronary artery disease could reoccur. Detainee will require regular surveillance, as the stents can fail.

3. (S) Detainee Summary:

a. (S) Detention Information: Same as stated in JTF CG memo dated 21 December 2002.

b. (S) Prior Assessment: On 4 June 2004, BG Jay W. Hood, Commander, JTF Guantanamo, recommended that detainee be considered for transfer for continued detention.

c. (S) Intelligence Value: JTF GTMO has determined that this detainee is of medium intelligence value.

4. (S) Detainee's Conduct: Detainee has a history of noncompliance. Although detainee's reported occurrences have typically been refusal of meds and meals, he has also had incidents requiring physical restraint by guards and appears to be a leader on the blocks.


5. (S) EC Status: Detainee's enemy combatant status was reassessed on 24 February 2004, and he remains an enemy combatant.

6. (S) JTF GTMO New Assessment:

a. (S) Summary: JTF GTMO has determined that the detainee poses a low risk, due to his medical condition.

b. (S) Recommendation: Based on the detainee's health status, intelligence value and risk level, JTF GTMO recommends this detainee be released or transferred to the control of another country for continued detention.

7. (S) Coordination: JTF GTMO notified the Criminal Investigative Task Force (CITF) of this recommendation on 27 June 2004. JTF GMTO and CITF agree on the threat of this detainee.
