**GENERAL COUNCIL
Of the City of New Orleans.**
MAYOR-AT-LAW OF NEW ORLEANS,
THIRTY-FIRST, 1852.
Special Meeting of Boarders, January 24, 1852.
AS ORGANIZED.
To establish an uniform rule of trade and business
on perambulators, carriages and other business and on
carriages, buggies, drays and other vehicles.
Be it ordered by the General Council of the
City of New Orleans:
Art. 1st. That from and after the first day of Jan-
uary 1852, the tax and license for professionals, car-
riages, and other business throughout the city and par-
ishes of New Orleans, and on carriages, buggies, dray-
es, and other vehicles which may be used, sold or
shall be fitted, seen and collected in the same
and same specialty set forth in the following no-
tices:
