EXTRAORDINARY NOVELTY.

The Legislature of New-Jersey commenced its session yesterday. Among the important subjects that are to come up for consideration, the following applications are mentioned—for four new counties; for the Delaware and Raritan Canal; for a loan of credit for \$300,000 to the Morris Canal Company; for a rail road from Camden to the bay of Abey; for a dam in the Delaware, or Trenton; for altering the judicial system of the State; for a change in the Constitution of the State and of the U. States; for an alteration in the tax laws; for a system of free schools; for a road across the Blue Mountains, and for prohibiting by law the circulation of bank notes under five dollars.

Dismal Sweep Canal.—The Norfolk papers announce that the water has been let into the Canal to the depth of three feet and a half, and that boats of that draught are already upon it. In about three months the Canal is expected to be finished. "When we consider," says a letter from Norfolk, that this Canal opens an avenue of 100 miles in extent, to many of the finest counties of North Carolina and Virginia, and exhaustless stores of the most valuable products of our country, calculations on the result can hardly be carried too high on estimate. Not only Cotton and Tobacco in increased abundance, but millions of bushels of wheat, &c. which, from the expense of land carriage, would never have been raised for transportation in that way, will now be drawn from the bosom of the earth, and floated down with convenience and profit to the Norfolk market.

An enterprising Capitalist in the mercantile line, came down the other day from one of the upper counties bordering on the route of this new inland commerce, and rather surprised our citizens by taking up at once the large public warehouses on Town Point which have been some time vacant."

Living Ghost.—A circumstance rather out of the ordinary channel of events, took place upon this Island a few nights since, which for the heroism of those concerned, as well as for the entertainment of our readers generally, it will be proper to relate.

Two of our citizens, noted for unflinched resolution and a liberal share of humour and wit, happening to meet each other a few evenings ago at Sciasconet, concerted a plan something like the following.—That at the flood of the tide, which was to be about midnight they would repair to the shore where the brig Packet was wrecked; and perhaps be so fortunate as to find a bolt of duck, a bolt of diaper, or something which might reward them for the loss of sleep and rest. This concerted scheme, very differently from what they had reason to suspect, was overheard by a third person, who immediately communicated it to a fourth; and of course the two latter gentleman, (being up to a thing or two) took their turn to carry on a little scheming. They agreed to go to the shore about half an hour in advance of the two duck and diaper speculators. Accordingly they went and one, by the name of Jo Stout, warmly clad, and wrapped snugly in a pea jacket, was stretched out on the beach just above the washing of the surf; and the other, concealed partly by wild grass and partly by a little eminence a few rods from the shore, waited the issue. They first touched the body with their long sticks, then composed to that kind of resolution which is re-

quired to lay hands on a dead man, washed on shore at the dead of night, and commenced rolling him up the sandy beach. Jo Stout was lying face down, with his legs, arms and body, as still and motionless as if they had been in the cold embrace of death for weeks. The two duck hunters had not rolled the supposed corpse over more than three times, when Jo fetched a solemn, loud, sepulchral groan, which might have frightened even a hyena from a corpse; whereupon our chevaliers started for Sciasconet with a velocity surpassing that of the zebra, a tempest of sand flying for rods behind their heels; and Jo fearing the terror might prove fatal, vociferated with the voice of a Stentor—I'm Jo Stout! But with such astonishing swiftness had the affrighted completed, that even the voice of Jo did not reach Sciasconet till some seconds after the trembling fugitives had arrived!
