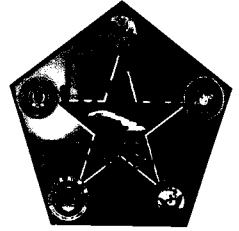

SUBJECT: Recommendation to Transfer to the Control of Another Country for Continued Detention (TRCD) for Guantanamo Detainee, ISN: US9AF-000849DP (S)

2. (FOUO) Health: Detainee is in good health, has no known drug allergies, and is not currently on any medications. He has no travel restrictions.

3. (S//NF) JTF GTMO Assessment:

a. (S) Recommendation: JTF GTMO recommends detainee be Transferred to the Control of Another Country for Continued Detention (TRCD).

b. (S//NF) Summary: JTF GTMO previously assessed this detainee as Transfer to the Control of Another Country for Continued Detention (TRCD) on 29 March 2004.

For this update recommendation, detainee is assessed as being a possible member of the Taliban. Detainee was arrested on the night of 16 October 2002, as he and three others were preparing to fire BM-12 rockets into Jalalabad, AF. Detainee confessed to being responsible for the 28 August 2002 BM-12 rocket attack at Jalalabad airport that struck nearby a team of

US Army soldiers. Detainee named his co-conspirators as Qari Noor Wali, Ghulam Ali, and Qari Sheera Jan, all suspected Taliban members. As of October 2002, Wali, Ali, and Jan remained at large. It is assessed this detainee is a MEDIUM risk, as he may possibly pose a threat to the US, its interests and allies.

4. (S//NF) Detainee Background Summary: Unless otherwise noted, the following paragraphs are based solely on the detainee's statements.

a. (S) Prior History: From 1987-1995, detainee worked on his family's sheep farm. After his father died in 1995, detainee started doing general labor for other people. Detainee worked from December 2001 to Jan 2002 as a policeman under Lashkar Khan's command in Hesarak, AF.

b. (S) Training and Activities: Detainee was trained on the AK-47 for his position as a policeman. He was under the command of Lashkar Khan (a pro-Interim government commander), in the area of Jalalabad, AF. In approximately August 2002, detainee was awakened in the middle of the night by Shir Jan and Ghulam Ali, two former Taliban members. They entered his home armed and told detainee that if he ever worked, talked, or associated with Lashkar Khan again they would kill him. Subsequently, they forced him to go with them to retrieve two hidden rockets. They set up the rockets and fired them in the direction of Khan's house, toward Jalalabad. Later, detainee was told he was going to retrieve more rockets and fire them.

c. (S//NF) Capture Information: On 16 October 2002, the police came to detainee's house. Detainee took the police out to his garden, where they found some rockets. The police placed him under arrest and took him to Jalalabad. When captured, detainee had in his possession a Russian artillery officer's compass, blasting circuit tester, and three rocket motors. No further capture information is available.

d. (S) Transferred to JTF GTMO: 6 February 2003

e. (S//NF) Reasons for Transfer to JTF GTMO: To provide information on the following:

- Shir Jan's operation and his anti-American/anti-Interim government activist operations including recruitment
 - Involvement in the 28 August 2002 rocket attacks on Jalalabad, AF
- Rocket systems and capabilities

5. (S//NF) Detainee Threat:

a. (S) Assessment: It is assessed the detainee poses a MEDIUM risk, as he may possibly pose a threat to the US, its interests and allies.

b. (S//NF) Reasons for Continued Detention:

- (S) Mohammed Hashim, US9AF-000850DP (ISN 850), describes detainee as having trained on light weapons, machine guns, and missiles. (Analyst Note: This contradicts detainee's claims.)
 - (S) ISN 850 describes detainee as having fought against U.S. forces in Jalalabad, AF. He states detainee had been with the Taliban for 5-6 years prior to his capture.
 - (S) ISN 850 saw detainee at a training camp south of Khandahar. He heard detainee was going to attend missile training.
 - (S) ISN 850 referred to detainee as a member of a 40-man team who worked for Taliban commander Ameenullah aka Ullah Amin, US9AF-000848DP (ISN 848).
- (S//NF) Detainee was associated with Shir Jan, aka Qari Sheera Jan. Jan is a known anti-American activist and probable Taliban commander. He is responsible for recruitment of operatives involved in actions against US and coalition forces. Jan was directly involved in the 28 August 2002 rocket attack on Jalalabad, AF. Detainee admits he fired rockets on Jalalabad on both 28 August 2002 and 16 October 2002, under Jan's direction
 - (S) Detainee has tried to downplay his ties with Jan. His stories about Jan are inconsistent, as the following demonstrates:
 - (S) Detainee stated he only met with Jan alone two times.
 - (S) Detainee stated he met Shir Jan three times.
 - (S) Detainee stated that there were others with Jan. He did not know who they were because they were in the distance.
 - (S) In another statement, detainee gave the names of the others who were with Jan. They were Qari Noor Wali (Shir Jan's cousin) and Ghulam Ali, a Taliban member.
 - (S//NF) In another attempt to distance himself from the attacks, detainee stated he was only being shown how to fire rockets.
 - (S//NF) Detainee later states the rockets were fired toward Jalalabad. (Analyst note: These rockets struck close to a team of US Army soldiers.)
 - (S) Contradicting previous statements about not knowing the intended target, detainee later states the target of the attacks was Lashkar Khan's bodyguard post. This was located a few hundred yards from Khan's house outside of Jalalabad.
 - (S) Detainee confessed their target was the postal office in Canibaugh, AF. It was not hit in the first attempt, so Jan told detainee to be ready to attack it again.

- (S//NF) Detainee was captured with a Russian artillery officer's compass, blasting circuit tester, and three rocket motors. The blasting circuit tester, type LP4, serial number 19754, was made by Nitro Nobel, S-710 30, Gyttop, Sweden. He denies having possession of this equipment.

c. (S//NF) Detainee's Conduct: Detainee has verbally harassed guards (on 2 February 2005) and has threatened to commit hostile acts (on 21 December 2004). Detainee has been reported for failures to comply as well requesting special meals, then turning them down on arrival.

6. (S//NF) Detainee Intelligence Value Assessment:

a. (S) Assessment: JTF GTMO has determined that this detainee is of MEDIUM intelligence value.

- (S//NF) Detainee could provide information on the Taliban, areas of operation, and chain of command. Detainee could also provide details about the use of rockets, specifically their use in missions against the US, its allies, or the new Afghan government. Detainee utilizes counter-interrogation techniques by contradicting himself or by offering small bits of information not previously divulged. Detainee has persistently tried to keep himself separated from Taliban commander Shir Jan and his group.


b. (S//NF) Areas of Potential Exploitation:

- Operations with the Taliban commander, Shir Jan
 - Relationship to Shir Jan
 - Shir Jan's areas of operation
 - Shir Jan's
 - Superiors
 - Subordinates
 - Future plans of attack on coalition forces
 - Areas of possible hiding
- Military training
 - Detainee's locations for training
 - Detainee's specific areas for which he was trained, i.e. rockets, AK-47

7. (S) EC Status: Detainee's enemy combatant status was reassessed on 14 December 2004, and he remains an enemy combatant.

Health Assessment: ISN 849 has a history of latent tuberculosis and reflux. Otherwise, he is in good health.

Background and Capture Data: Detainee was captured by American Forces soldiers after a rocket attack. The detainee admitted that he had been part of one rocket attack. Detainee stated that an individual by the name of Shir Jan forced him to participate in the attack and to hide the rockets.

Date of Capture: 15 October 2002

Risk Level: High JTF GTMO has assessed that the detainee will commit to any action if

Risk Assessment: there is profit in it and therefore is a risk to US soldiers and interests. According to ISN US9AF-000850DP, Mohammed Hashim, detainee was a member of a 40-man team. According to sensitive information, detainee worked for a Taliban Commander, Amin Ullah, US9AF-000848DP.

Intelligence Value: Low

Exploitation Requirements: Knowledge of: 1) Taliban personalities; 2) possible future attacks against US interests; 3) as rocket systems; and 4) Shir Jan's operation and his anti-American government activities operations including recruitment.

Recommendation: Transfer to the Control of Another Country for Continued Detention.
