Circular—The government has received information that, in the United States of North America, meating are called for the avowed purpose of getting up and fitting out expeditions against the Republic of Mexico, in order to send assistance to the rebels, foster the civil war, and inflict upon our country oil the culamities by which it is followed. In the United States, our ancient ally, expeditions are now organized similar to that headed by the traitor Jose Antonio Mejia, and some hove even set out for Texas. They have been furnished with every kind of anumnition, by means of which the revolted colonists are enabled to reasist and fight the nation from which they never have received but immense benefits. They government is also positively informed that these acts, condemned by the wisdem of the laws of the United States, are also reported by the general government, with which the best intelligence und the greatest larmony still prevail. However, as these adventurers and speculators have succeeded in escaping the penal ties inflicted by the laws of their own country, it becomes necessary to adopt measures for their punishment. His excellency the president ad interim, anx ious to repress these aggressions which constitute no-only an offence to the sovereignty of the Mexican nat tion, but also to an evident violation of international was as they are generally adopted, has ordered the following decrees to be enforced.

Lat. Foreigners landing on the coast of the republic or invading its territory by land, armed and with the intention of attacking our country, will be deemed pirates and dealt with as such, being citizens of no nation presently at war with the republic, and fighting under no recognised flag.

2nd. All foreigners who will import either by sea er land, in the placers occupied by the refuse of them will be deemed pirates and punished as such.

I send you these decrees, that you may cause them to be fully executed.
